

# 7 SUCCESS STORIES 2017

Looking back on 2017 the City of Port Alberni's Mayor, Council and staff achieved a great deal that helped put us on the path to a renewed sense of who we are as a town. This feature looks back on the projects and programs that helped make 2017 a successful year for the City and its citizens.

## 1 Funding Our New Wastewater Treatment Facility

The City of Port Alberni's wastewater treatment facility, which is roughly 70 years old, requires upgrading in order to meet new federal wastewater treatment standards. To help pay for these upgrades and reduce the financial burden on taxpayers, city staff have been pursuing grant opportunities. In 2017 the City received a 6.9 million dollar grant from the Clean Water and Wastewater Fund. Combined with grants received in previous years, the City has now received a total of 18.1 million dollars for this project.

## **12** Fresh Faces For Port Alberni Businesses

The City of Port Alberni, in partnership with Community Futures Alberni-Clayoquot, established a Façade Improvement Program in 2016. This program assists property and business owners with improving the physical appearance of their buildings. In 2017 a total of 15 businesses took advantage of this program that invested more than \$150,000 into facades on a matching funds basis.

# Building Up a Piece of History

The McLean Mill Historic Park is an ever-growing all-season park nestled in a beautiful west coast forest setting. Owned by the City of Port Alberni and operated by the McLean Mill Society, this property has something for everyone and has become a hotspot for tourists and locals alike. After only one year of operation under a new governance structure, the City is proud to announce that the park turned a profit in 2017 and created 30 new jobs for the Alberni Valley. # A Year of Truth and Reconciliation

To foster relations between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in the Alberni Valley, the City created a Reconciliation Committee comprised of local First Nations, community members and an appointed council member. This committee is responsible for investigating and reporting on actions to help strengthen relationships, increase cultural awareness and understanding, and support the building of a welcoming and inclusive community.

In October 2017 the City of Port Alberni celebrated its 50 year union between Alberni and Port Alberni.

## Open For Business

The year 2017 saw substantial growth in Port Alberni's business sector with 110 applications for new business licenses and 445 renewals of existing business licenses. This gives us a grand total of 555 licensed businesses in Port Alberni – an increase of 20% from 2016!

## **7** Big City Problems

In December 2017 the Committee of the Whole, key stakeholders and members of the public met to discuss 'Big City Problems' in Port Alberni. A number of actions arose from that meeting including increased RCMP foot patrols, the distribution of an emergency contact list to businesses in affected areas and the establishment of the Nuisance Building Working Group. In 2018 Council will continue to consider further steps to help build a safe, vibrant and welcoming community for all to enjoy.
