J. Mayba

Addressed proposed intersection improvements for 10th Avenue and Dunbar Street and expressed support for the removal of the left turn lane.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Financial Plan Q&A Summary

Council received the summary of questions and responses as it relates to the 2023 – 2027 Financial Planning process.

BYLAWS

Council rescinded third reading of the "City of Port Alberni 2023 – 2027 Financial Plan Bylaw No. 5075, 2023" in order to address a matter of procedure. Council then proceeded to reapprove the amendments before reinstating third reading of the Bylaw.

- "City of Port Alberni Tax Rates Bylaw No. 5083, 2023" was deferred to the Special meeting of Council scheduled April 25th at 5:30 pm.
- "City of Port Alberni Officers and Indemnification Bylaw No. 5061, 2023" was adopted. The bylaw provides for the indemnification of municipal officials.
- "City of Port Alberni Development Procedures Bylaw No. 5076, 2023" was introduced and given three readings. The bylaw, upon adoption will serve to improve processing timelines of land use applications, fulfill requirements of Section 460 of the Local Government Act, and align with provincial legislation changes like Bill 26 to decrease processing times in order to increase housing supply.

"Official Community Plan Amendment (2846 4th Avenue) Bylaw No. 5078, 2023" and "Zoning Amendment (2846 4th Avenue) Bylaw No. 5079, 2023" were introduced, given first and second reading, and advanced to a Public Hearing to be held Tuesday, May 23, 2023 at 6:00 pm in City Hall Council Chambers.

These bylaws, upon adoption will enable a fourunit townhouse development at 2846 4th Avenue.

Sale of Somass Equipment

Council directed staff to prepare a status report as it relates to the proposed intersection improvements for 10th Avenue and Dunbar Street including the project scope, timelines and next steps.

May 3rd, 2023 Report to the Heritage Commission

- The WVIIHS held a successful AGM on April 12th with 50 people in attendance.
- Some volunteers from the APR undertook a 3-day Canadian Railway Operating Rules
 Course at the Port Alberni Visitor Centre this past weekend. We now have 12 certified
 crew members. We thank the Alberni Valley Chamber of Commerce for allowing us to
 use their space.
- We continue to have security problems at the APR Roundhouse with attempted breakins; no-goods setting up in a passenger coach and re-cutting holes in the fence.
 IHS members have securing and repairing fences and have installed another motionsensor light. No word on the Stolen "Two-Spot" bell.
- Planning for the "No. 7 Steam Festival" is currently underway. As always for event planning, lots of hurdles to get over. We have secured one major sponsor, Dog Mountain Brewing for the event.
- 5. Planning for the 2023 "Antique Trucks and Machinery Show" is underway.
- Volunteers are prepping many vehicles at the Industrial Heritage Center for the 2023 show season.
- 7. Two children's visits are taking place next week at the IHC.
- The new Executive and Board of Directors has been elected for 2023. President Ron Corbeil, Vice-President – Richard Spencer, Secretary/Treasurer – Mel Francoeur, Directors: Bill Walker, Kevin Hunter, Barry Dobrensky, John Land, Andy Richards, Bruce Holland, Joel Larsen.
- Richard Spencer has been appointed as the new APR Manager. Richard is currently
 organizing all that needs to be accomplished for proposed operations in 2024, including
 an operations budget, business plan and sponsorships.



c. School District

- i. The next Regular Public meeting for Pacific Rim School District is Tuesday May 23 at 5pm at the Board office.
- ii. The last Public Meeting of the Board was held in Tofino at Wickanninish School April 11, 2023. The Board meets once a year in Tofino and once a year in Ucluelet. These meetings are an opportunity for the communities to present to the Board and ask questions about the agendas. The April 11th meeting was an opportunity for Budget input from the west coast communities. The Bamfield Community School Coordinator, Jaslyn Haberl, presented.
- iii. Trustees have completed their choice for the Trustee Bursary application process. June 14th is Scholarship/Bursary Night at ADSS.
- iv. Pacific Rim School District Indigenous Education Department has completed preparation for classroom Teachers to have the background and materials for their students on the George Clutesi Exhibit (teacher info flyer attached).
- v. The communication of student learning to parents and families is changing and the format of traditional report cards is shifting. The use of the Provincial Proficiency Scale gives students, parents and caregivers a clear understanding of what students can do now and areas for growth. The Proficiency Scale has four categories: Emerging; Developing; Proficient; Extending. This new feedback views learning as ongoing, rather than signalling the learning is done. It is presented as descriptive feedback. Letter grades and percentages will still be presented at Grades 10 12 (a post-secondary requirement).

- vii. The Board of Education is continuing to meet with other levels of local government and community groups. In April the Board met with the Tseshaht Council. The District's Strategic Planning process is in the collating phase, pulling together the survey input and the information gathered from the rightsholders, local governments, partner groups and community groups.

PAMHS Report to the Heritage Commission May 3, 2023

The Board of the Port Alberni Maritime Society is pleased to welcome the Heritage Commission to our Gallery for the May meeting of the Commission. The PAHMS activities over the past month are summarized below.

- Dory Build Chris Johnson is building a small traditional Grand Banks Dory (wooden rowboat) in the shipyard. Construction is open to the public to watch on Thursdays. The vessel will be built using traditional hand tools. Construction is progressing well and Shaw Cable has been coming weekly to film the progress. You can check out the plans and progress on this interesting project on our Facebook Page.
- Maritime Heritage Night on Wednesday, May 17th, 7-9 pm we are hosting an open house
 which will focus on the history of the vessel "Lady Rose". Geo Monrufet will be there to tell us
 some of his experiences on the Lady Rose. There will also be the opportunity for attendees to
 share their stories and remembrances of the "Lady Rose".
- Lighthouse Repairs We are fundraising, applying for available grants, and looking for
 community donors to help us undertake an exterior upgrade on the Lighthouse to get it looking
 its best again. This will be an expensive project with quotes in the order of \$50,000 to
 complete the work. We were very pleased to receive notice from the Alberni Valley
 Community Foundation this month that they will contribute \$5000 toward this project. Thanks
 very much to the Board of the AVCF.
- Open Hours We are now open 4 days a week, Fridays to Monday from 11am to 4pm. In
 addition the shipyard is open to view the dory build on Thursdays. Please stop in to our
 Gallery and lighthouse to meet our Facilities Coordinator Chris Johnson and learn some
 interesting facts about our maritime history in Port Alberni.

h. Chamber of Commerce

- i. I am thrilled to be in this new role and each day has been exciting and fulfilling. I am proud to share that there is an amazing team here at the Chamber that has been essential to my success by providing me support in this first month.
- ii. Each day we are seeing more and more people coming into the Visitor Centre.
