Hi Scott,

Thanks so much for returning my call today.

We are interested in knowing what the procedure is to propose the installation of a new stop sign in our neighbourhood.

We live at the intersection of 2nd and Sterling on the SW corner directly across from Ty Watson Hospice and we often see people driving very fast through the intersection, heading west/downhill on Sterling toward 1st Avenue.

It is a very steep incline and almost impossible to see anyone driving up the hill or walking across the street until the vehicle you're in is the middle of the intersection or already on the downward slope.

RCMP Officer Andy Bezanson experienced this steep part of the street on Stirling that starts at the intersection of 2nd Avenue. He was not familiar with the street and basically lost control in the snow and had to drive up on the boulevard of our backyard and smash the RCMP truck he was driving into my neighbours car to avoid sliding all the way down the hill. [He was unsure if Stirling Street that ends at 1st Avenue had a cliff on the opposite side of 1st beyond the trees].

Our concern is that we see people, mostly younger drivers, speeding through the intersection without slowing to see if children or vehicles could be obstructing their right of way, to avoid a collision.

Our proposal is to have a stop sign installed on the North East Corner of the intersection to help prevent potential safety issues/collisions. We often pull out of our driveway on Stirling hoping someone doesn't come barrelling down the hill without slowing for a visual first.

If vehicles were to stop at the intersection, that already has two stop signs North and Southbound on 2nd Avenue, once the vehicle starts to accelerate after the stop sign, the speed will be minimal and the drivers will be able to see if anything is obstructing the road in time to stop if there is a need to.

This would make the intersection a 3 way stop. It would not be advisable to make it a 4 way stop due to the incline of Stirling Street before 2nd Avenue heading east.

I look forward to hearing from you on what the procedure is to see if this is possible, or if anyone there agrees with this idea.

Mayor Douglas:

Greetings.

The area in Port Alberni between Johnston / Helen to Johnston / Broughton has probably the greatest vehicle volume of traffic in the City of Port Alberni.

Because of this, and for the safety of pedestrians walking between these street intersections, please order the construction of painted white-lined cross walks in between these street instersections and in particular for the following locations: Johnston / Bishop, Johnston / Merrifield, Johnston / Muir.

It is also recommended that a crosswalk be established on 10th Avenue to allow pedestrian travel from the Safeway to Fairway supermarkets and the repainting as required of all faded crosswalks in the Johnston Rd, 10th Avenue and 3rd Avenue areas.

Please also take action against jaywalkers (those who walk or cross a street illegally by disobeying traffic rules and signals, at the wrong places by failing to use the legal crosswalk) as this is potentially hazardous to both pedestrians and motorists and it is noted that fines have been issued in other British Columbia municipalities for this infraction.
