SUBJECT: Early Budget Approval – Multiplex Chiller

ISSUE:

Early budget approval is required for the replacement of the Chiller at the Multiplex.

BACKGROUND:

The City-owned Multiplex facility, built in 2001, utilizes a Chiller in the Ice Plant to help create and maintain the ice surface. The current Chiller, original to the building, has reached the end of its service life. At the April 10, 2017 Regular Meeting of Council, Council adopted the Five Year Financial Plan Bylaw 2017-2021, Bylaw No. 4932, including replacement of the Multiplex Ice Plant Chiller, at a projected expense of \$175,000. That replacement project and associated funding is scheduled for 2018.

DISCUSSION:

The Multiplex enjoys almost year-round ice usage. While that helps maximize facility use, it presents a challenge when scheduling service interruption caused by the Chiller replacement project. The preferred window to minimize service interruption is April 15 – June 15, 2018. In order to replace the Chiller during the April 15 – June 15 period, a Request for Proposal process, selection of vendor and delivery of the equipment all need to be completed. Council approval of the project is required in December 2017 as the first step in that process.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that Council approves the request for early budget approval of \$175,000 for replacement of the Chiller, including \$50,000 from the department's General Fund, and \$125,000 from the Carbon Trust Fund.

The following resolution is proposed:

That Council for the City of Port Alberni approve the request for early budget approval of \$175,000 for replacement of the Multiplex Ice Plant Chiller, comprised of funding from the Parks, Recreation and Heritage General Fund (\$50,000) and Carbon Trust Fund (\$125,000).

Lease Agreement between City and ADFFA 2015 - 2020

SUBJECT: Eviction from City Lands – Alberni Paving

Issue:

The City has received a letter from Alberni District Fall Fair Association (ADFFA) requesting that the City rescind an eviction notice issued to Alberni Paving.

Background:

Alberni Paving occupies City-owned lands adjacent to the Fall Fair grounds, generally described as "behind the horse barns and riding area." Alberni Paving has been a long term tenant of ADFFA at the Fall Fair grounds, and in recent years expanded that tenancy to include occupation of City-owned lands under a sub-lease from ADFFA. When the matter was investigated in 2014 it was determined that:

- The location of Alberni Paving's secondary occupancy is outside of the area leased from the City to ADFFA and therefore not within ADFFA's ability to sublet.
- Regardless of location relative to the lands leased by ADFFA, the lease agreement prohibits both subletting without City approval, and use of the leased lands for an "activity that shall be deemed a nuisance on the land."
- Alberni Paving's use of the City-owned lands is considered a light industrial use. The land is zoned for Parks use.
- City staff may have consented verbally to the occupancy when it occurred.

At a Special In-Camera Council meeting on October 14th 2014 Council for the City of Port Alberni considered the matter and passed the following motion:

"That Council for the City of Port Alberni direct staff to provide a report to a regular meeting of Council providing a synopsis and options for consideration with regards to Alberni Paving operations at the Fall Fair Grounds."

Subsequent to that direction City staff interacted with Alberni Paving and undertook a review of available locations suitable for relocation of Alberni Paving operations. That process was not successful.

At a special meeting of Council for the purpose of reviewing the Status Report on December 12, 2016 Council directed that an eviction notice be issued. A letter of Notice of Eviction was issued on March 10, 2017.

Discussion:

The presence of Alberni Paving on City-owned lands is problematic for the reasons noted above. While there was no ill intent by any parties involved in the creation of this issue, the current situation cannot continue without some action by the City. The City must either put an end to the tenancy or enable the tenancy by taking steps to bring the tenancy into compliance.

If the City takes no action, thus permitting a land use contrary to zoning and without legal occupancy, the City would then have difficulty enforcing bylaws regarding land use zoning in other situations that arise.

Options:

Option One: - Continue with the Eviction

This option involves staying the course set by Council on December 12th 2016. Both Alberni Paving and ADFFA have reported that this option will cause them hardship.

Option Two: - Extend the Notice of Eviction Period

This option involves staying the course set by Council on December 12th 2016, while providing a greater amount of time for Alberni Paving to find a suitable new location and ADFFA to explore options for adjusting to the loss of revenue.

Option Three: - Enable the Tenancy

This option involves the City taking action to enable the tenancy, thus supporting Alberni Paving to be a longer term tenant at the current location. Actions required to enable the tenancy include:

- 1. Amend the Official Community Plan and the zoning of the land parcel currently used by Alberni Paving from Parks use to Light Industrial use.
- 2. Amend the lease between the City and the ADFFA to add the area currently occupied by Alberni Paving to the lease area.
- 3. Authorize the ADFFA to sublet to Alberni Paving.

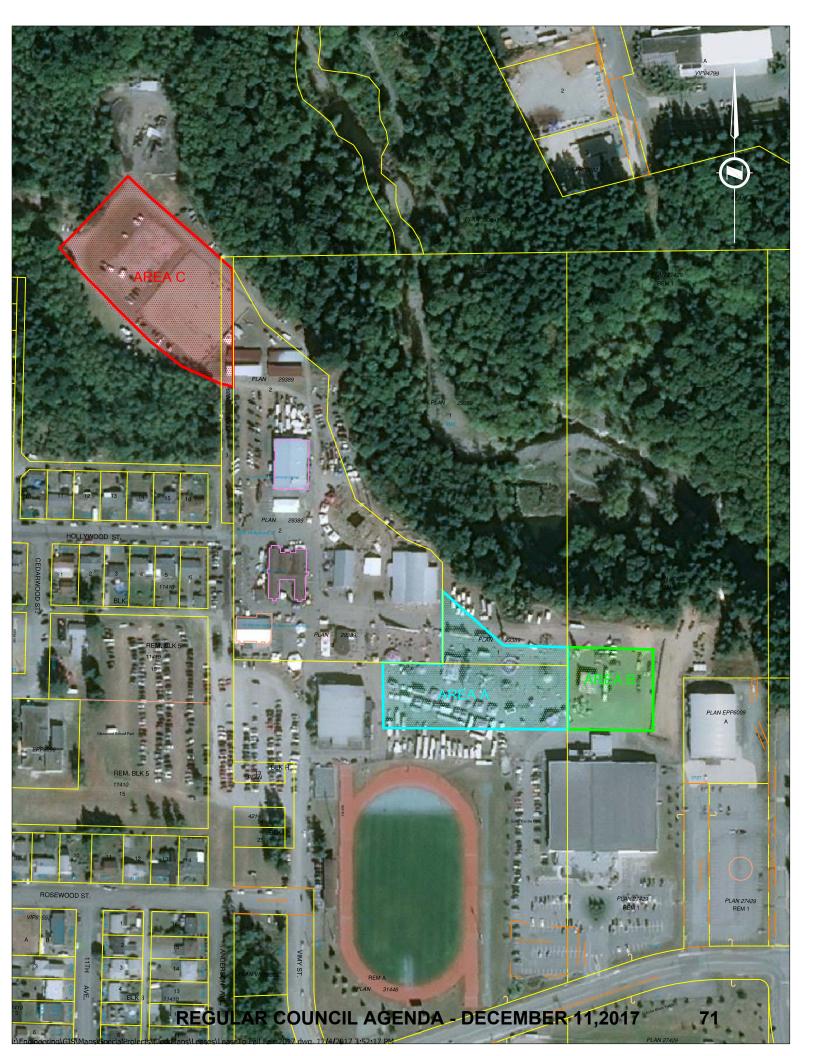
Recommendation:

Re: City owned land Alberni Paving is utilizing

The Alberni District Fall is the largest family oriented community event in the Alberni Valley. Looking back at the history of the fair, things looked a lot different; in the late thirties, when the Farmer's Institute hosted the first local Fall Fair. The Alberni Valley was then an active farming community and a venue was needed to exhibit all the fine agricultural products the valley was producing. The fair became a lively social event for hard working people that came together and celebrated the fruits of their year-long labour.

The Second World War interrupted the flow of the fair, but in early 1946 the Farmers Institute who had traditionally organized the fair approached the Kinsmen Club of Port Alberni about hosting the event. In April 1946 the Alberni District Fall Fair became an entity. The first fall fair was held in September of that year on the present site.

The Alberni District Fall Fair has come a long way since then. Over the years, we've seen the number of buildings increase, gradual development of the grounds and amenities, and additions to displays and attractions.

Most of the buildings were erected throughout the late seventies and early eighties by volunteers, such as the Kinsmen Community Center, Stephen's Building, the Van Ipren Building, Kinette Food Booth, 4-H Cattle Barn, the horse rings and stables that are used by several horse groups throughout the year.

Today the Alberni District Fall Fair has an eleven-member Board of Directors made up of Kinsmen Club members and volunteers at large as well as one staff to oversee administrative needs. The Fair is fortunate to have many volunteers of all ages that give endless amounts of their time to help with all aspects of putting on an event of this magnitude. Assistance also comes by way of outside organizations using the fair as a fundraising initiative. The fair has an economic impact on the community, we purchase local goods, draw in people who utilize local accommodations and spend money in local restaurants. This past year we had over 18,000 visitors attend over the four days. All revenues that are generated through the Alberni District Fall Fair are re-invested into upkeep of the grounds and to build on this community event. However, this alone does not sustain the fair, we rely on our buildings being rented in the

offseason. Alberni Paving has been renting the Van Ipren Building for over 30 years, The yearly income of \$12,000. plus \$3000 worth of yearly paving, and in-kind services such as snow removal that Alberni Paving provides is a vital part of the sustainability of the fall fair. The Van Ipren building is not conducive for other rental opportunities because of the lay out of the building with its many pillars and where they are structurally placed, it has worked perfectly for this business to fit their large trucks into the space.

The Alberni District Fall Fair Board of Directors had conversations with the then Director of Recreation Scott Kenny who assured us that the property in question would not interfere with any development in Roger Creek directly below the site, and should be suitable for the purposes that Alberni Paving wanted to utilize it for, but recognize we should have further investigated to make sure the property belonged to the fair or was leased land.

After over a year of extensive search by both local realtors and your city Economic Development office there is no land available in the community that would meet Alberni Paving needs. We were informed that the City of Port Alberni has now given Alberni Paving a one- year notice to vacate, and the time frame is soon up.

The Alberni District Fall Fair is really concerned that once Alberni Paving has been forced to move the plant elsewhere it will more than likely be forced to move out of the valley or the business will fold, and the loss of rental income will drastically impact the fair, and the city will see the loss of one well established business.

We appreciate all the support we have received from the City of Port Alberni and realize that there are many non-for-profit organizations relying on the city for support. We hope that a satisfactory solution is found that won't directly impact city tax payers.

The Alberni District Fall Fair Executive would welcome an opportunity to discuss this issue with city council and look forward to your response.

4.1 The tenant may use the property solely for activities related to the Annual Fall Fair and other special activities organized and/or hosted by the Alberni District Fall Fair Association, such as camper caravans, demolition derbies and tractor pulls, etc. Any structures or amenities placed on the lands must be of a temporary and readily removable nature.

5.0 TENANT'S COVENANTS

The tenant covenants as follows:

- 5.1 To pay rent; and to pay taxes.
- 5.2 To use the premises only for the purposes set forth in paragraph 4.1.
- 5.3 To repair.
- 5.4 To keep up fences.
- 5.5 That the property will not be assigned or sublet without leave.
- 5.6 To leave the land in good repair.
- 5.7 Not to carry on any business nor conduct or allow any activity that shall be deemed a nuisance on the land.
- 5.8 To observe and comply with all laws, statutes, regulations, by-laws, rules and orders relating to the premises and the use or occupation thereof.

6.0 LANDLORD'S COVENANTS

The landlord covenants:

6.1 For quiet enjoyment.

7.0 INSURANCE PROVISIONS

- 7.1 The Tenant shall at all times indemnify and save harmless the Landlord of and from all loss and damage and all actions, claims, costs, demands, expenses, fines, orders, penalties, liabilities and suits of any nature whatsoever by whomsoever brought for which the Tenant shall or may become liable, incur or suffer by reason of, connected to or arising from, whether directly or indirectly:
 - a) the use of the said land by the Tenant, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees or invitees;
 - b) a breach, violation or non-performance by the Tenant of any covenant, term or provision of this Lease;
 - any builders or other liens for any work done or materials provided or services rendered for alterations, improvements, or repairs made by or on on behalf of the Tenant to the said Lands;
 - any injury (including death) or loss to or suffered by any person or damage to property occasioned by any wrongful act or omission, default or negligence on the part of the Tenant, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees or invitees in or about the said land; and

- e) any enactment, regulation or order made by any authority having jurisdiction compelling or imposing on the Landlord in whole or in part any duty or obligation to clean up, prevent, contain or ameliorate any contamination or waste of whatsoever nature deposited, discharged, stored, emitted or spilled on, in, from, about or around the said land by the Tenant, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees and invitees or any enactment, regulation or order requiring the Landlord to pay in whole or in part for the same, including all costs and expenses of storage, transportation and disposal of such contamination or waste and the remediation of the said land and other lands and waters in or about the said land.
- 7.2 The Tenant's indemnity shall survive the expiry or termination of this Lease so that the Landlord shall be and remain fully indemnified and saved harmless in respect of any matter, whenever discovered, to which this indemnity applies that arose or occurred during the term of the Lease.
- 7.3 The Tenant shall procure and maintain in force at its own cost during the entire term of this lease a Comprehensive General Liability Insurance policy or policies with a limit of not less than \$5,000,000 inclusive per occurrence for bodily injury (including death), personal injury and property damage. The policy/policies shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the following coverages/provisions:
 - a) all land and operations necessary or incidental to the performance of this agreement;
 - b) products and completed operations;
 - c) "broad form" property damage;
 - d) blanket contractual liability;
 - e) cross liability; and
 - f) voluntary medical payments.

The Landlord shall be an "Additional Named Insured" with respect to the operations covered by the lease.

The policy or policies shall be underwritten by a responsible insurance company or companies licenced to do business in the Province of British Columbia. Such policy or policies shall provide that the coverage will be primary and shall not call into contribution or be in excess of any other insurance available to the Landlord and the coverage will not be canceled or materially altered without at least sixty (60) days prior written notice to the Landlord.

The policy or policies may provide that the amount payable in the event of any loss will be reduced by a deductible, in an amount to which the Landlord must consent. Consent, non-consent and/or unauthorized consent of the Landlord shall not constitute an agreement by the Landlord to participate in the financial undertaking of the Tenant to satisfy any deductible payable. The Tenant shall be solely responsible for any and all insurance deductible.

Upon the request of the Landlord, the Tenant shall furnish the Landlord with a Certificate or Certificates as evidence that such insurance is in place.

Maintenance of such insurance and the performance by the Tenant of its obligation under Section 7.3 shall not relieve the Tenant of its obligation to indemnify the Landlord as set forth in Section 7.1.

In the event that the Tenant fails to maintain any insurance as required by the Landlord, the Landlord may at its option, secure and maintain insurance coverage at such limits, with such deductible amounts, and for such periods of time as the Landlord deems reasonable. The Tenant will pay upon demand and to the Landlord, the Landlord's cost of maintaining and purchasing said insurance as required.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the Tenant to determine what additional insurance coverages, if any, including but not limited to Worksafe BC, are necessary and advisable for its own protection and/or to fulfill its obligations under this contract. Any such additional insurance shall be provided and maintained by the Tenant at its own expense.

8.0 RE-ENTRY

8.1 Proviso for re-entry by the Landlord on non-payment of rent or non-performance of covenants.

9.0 TERMINATION

- 9.1 Despite the term of this lease, it may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate.
- 9.2 On the termination of this lease, the Tenant shall, at his expense and if the Landlord requires, remove all fixtures an improvements installed by the Tenant on the premises.
- 9.3 In case the premises, or any part thereof, if damaged by fire or tempest so as to render it unfit for the Tenant's use, the said term shall immediately come to an end.

10.0 OTHER TERMS

- The Tenant shall permit to other groups the use of the area leased to the Tenant in this Agreement, subject to the following provisions:
 - (a) that the use of the leased area by other groups shall not be permitted in such a way so as to interfere with the set-up for, operation of and clean-up after the Annual Fall Fair, and;
 - (b) that such other groups shall indemnify both the Tenant and the Landlord under the same terms and conditions as set out in section 3(a) of this Agreement; and

(c) that such other groups shall provide liability insurance under the same terms and conditions as set out in section 3(b) of this Agreement, with the addition that the Alberni District Fall Fair Society shall also be an "Addition Named Insured".

A standard Letter of Understanding to be used for the purpose of the Tenant's granting permission for the use of the leased area by other groups is attached as Schedule "B".

11.0 HOLDING OVER

11.1 That if the Tenant shall hold over after the expiration of the term hereby granted, the new tenancy thereby created shall be a tenancy from month to month and not a tenancy from year to year, and shall be subject to the covenants and conditions herein contained so far as the same are applicable to a tenancy from month to month.

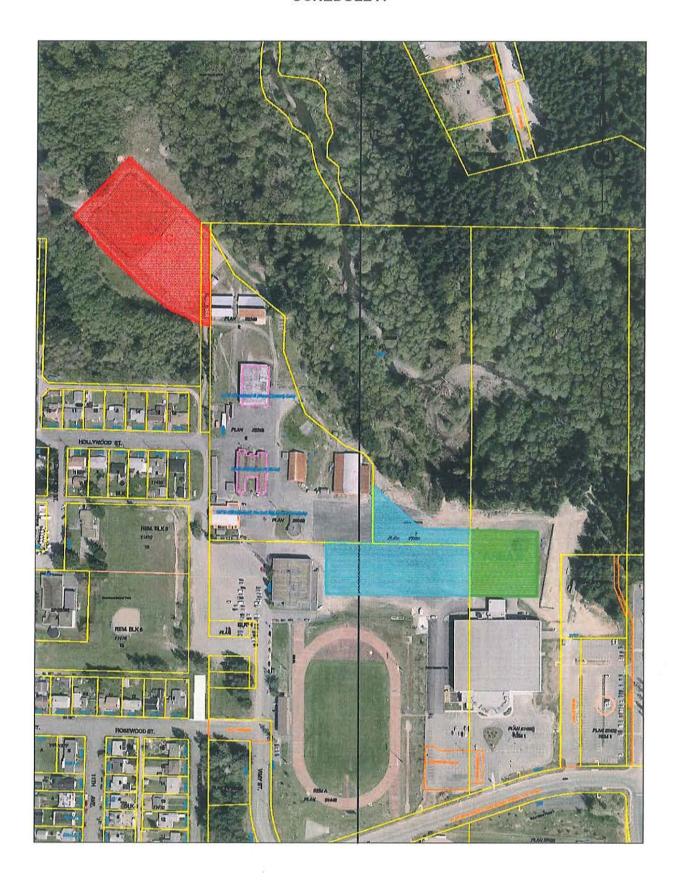

Maintenance of such insurance and the performance by the User Group of its obligation under paragraph 3 shall not relieve the User Group of its obligation to indemnify the Society and the City of Port Alberni as set forth in paragraph 2.

In the event that the User Group fails to maintain any insurance as required, the Society may at its option, secure and maintain insurance coverage at such limits, with such deductible amounts, and for such periods of time as the Society deems reasonable. The User Group will pay upon demand to the Society the Society's cost of maintaining and purchasing said insurance as required.

Having taken the time to assess our achievements this year throughout October & November now is the time to fine tune, finalize and lay the groundwork for a strong 2018 and beyond.

THANK YOU PORT ALBERNI VALLEY for your support this season, we could not be more pleased with our progress over our first season and will look forward to more growth and development as we enter into year 2 together.

Executive Director's Report to City Council

Maintenance

RAIL: We are going ahead with another 500 ties in early 2018 as part of our maintenance plan in addition to the work needed on the trestles. We have had crews out on the mainline changing faulty ties identified in our 2017 assessments throughout October and November. We have one remaining piece of remediation work to fully complete our 2017 maintenance plan and are on schedule.

NHS: We have identified a leaking roof in one of our historic buildings in the National Historic Site area of the Park, and have under the advice of the Museum and Heritage Commission taken it out of our exhibit. We have temporarily stopped the leak and are safe guarding the asset which will remain until spring when we can look at addressing the issue. You will note the blue tarp, over the "cook house" one of our guest favorites for the attention to detail in the curation, we have locked the doors and will not be allowing entrance to any other than professional MM Staff.

Development

Rail: As we have now identified our maintenance needs for the next ten years both on the rail line and with the trestles. We as a society are moving forward applying for grants and/or other applicable funding. We would like to be able to offer steam in 2018 + and will work hard to get the funding we need in order to sustainably make that happen. We are planning to operate with our second engine the 1945 diesel in the interim as we work on fundraising to bring back Steam. We are committed to bringing back our Baldwin Steam Engine into our operations and will continue to work towards achieving our fundraising goals in order to support the identified remediation work on our Trestles decks. We recognise the unique value as a community we hold in offering guests from around the world an attraction such is ours, Heritage Cultural tourism is an exceptional opportunity for our community to get behind and be proud to host in the McLean Mill Historic Park Destination.

Campsites: We have continued to develop our McLean MIII Campground. Due to the rain in the last weeks, progress has slowed. We are however on track for an April 2018 grand opening.

Watertower Stage: Earlier in the season it was identified that one of the natural gathering spaces within the NHS was the space in front of the water tower. We had the opportunity to host entertainers, beverage services, storytellers and more to speak to audiences in that area. Through the season we had been using a temporary decking to do this, having realized the opportunity we have now created a permanent, (also in keeping with the integrity and guidelines of the NHS) stage area to be enjoyed as a multi use space.

Executive Director's Report to City Council

Security / Event Lighting: As we have been hosting events right through the fall, we noted our guests has tended to be on the property as the seasonal light changed became much less favorable. As we are hosting many charters or evening events it became imperative to light the high traffic areas on the site - Train Platform to Village Courtyard, Courtyard itself, over the deck, Courtyard to National Historic Site/Camp Life area, the watertower and NHS courtyard, and the NHS Buildings. We have invested in energy efficient lighting that keeps with the integrity and authenticity of the NHS and period feel while providing ambient lighting for our private and corporate guests.

Audio / Visual: We have added another piece to the integrity of our executive meeting space, we are in the process of adding professional sound to the inside of our building which will allow for our corporate and event guests to have all technology amenities seamlessly integrated into the rental of the space. We also added "white lighting" which can be controlled separately from our warm ambient event lighting to better suit our executive guests.

Partnerships Development

Alberni Valley Heritage Commission: In my roll as Executive Director part of what I am constantly doing is helping to identify community partnerships and programing opportunities. As we are intent to develop the guest experience in the NHS area of the Park and surrounding forested areas an important step is finding field experts that have the sound knowledge to lend mind share to our development projects in order to keep our offerings rooted in the integrity of a remarkable guest experience. The Heritage Commission has a long and deep breadth of knowledge are are willing to help us craft a more integral guest tour among other things.

Parks, Recreation and Tourism: We hope to partner with PRH in the 2018 season to offer onsite programing for youth and families during school breaks. We will also be open to hosting part of Heritage Day, Our Town events and other family oriented opportunities.

Part of our vision as the McLean Mill Society and the importance of overseeing the growth and development of this community site is to execute on these underlying values: we want to offer Authentic Heritage Experiences, We want to develop viable economic development partnerships with in our site/community and to offer upscale with professional hospitality, event opportunities. We are committed to the growth of the Mclean Mill Historic Park and are committed to doing this in a sustainable and transparent way, rebuilding community trust and support.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEARING HELD ON TUESDAY DECEMBER 5, 2017 AT 6:00 PM IN COUNCIL CHAMBERS TO HEAR REPRESENTATION RELATIVE TO PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN AND ZONING BYLAW

The Chair explained the Public Hearing procedures for the meeting.

Applicant: Brandon Crema dba District Acquisitions Corporation

1. Description of the Application

The Director of Development Services provided a summary of the application:

The applicants are applying to amend the Official Community Plan Bylaw and the Zoning Bylaw to facilitate a phased development and subdivision of the property at 4000 Burde Street.

The proposed bylaws are:

- "Official Community Plan Amendment No. 25 (4000 Burde Street District Acquisitions Corp.), Bylaw No. 4952"
- "Zoning Map Amendment No. 27(4000 Burde Street District Acquisitions Corp.), Bylaw No. 4953"

2. Background Information from the Director of Development Services

The Director of Development Services provided background information regarding the proposed amendments by way of summarizing his report of November 28, 2017, attached hereto and forming part of this report.

3. Correspondence

The Director of Development Services read the late correspondence item (email dated December 1, 2017) from Dave Jarret. Mr. Jarrett's email expressed cautious support for the amendments and also some points of concern including the need for multi-level care facilities in the community and also concerns about the topography of the site and the need for good drainage plans.

4. Input from the Public regarding the Bylaw

<u>Pete Milliken of 15th Avenue</u> expressed concern about possible impact on neighbourhood if multi-family rental housing is not well managed. He also noted the need for weed control on the site as it becomes a fire hazard in dry weather.

<u>Brian Dulard of 14th Avenue</u> as a resident adjacent to the site, expressed the following:

- Loss of sun during winter months due to multi-family building height.
- Scenic views will be impacted and property values will be reduced.
- Need for weed control on the site.
- Possibility of increased traffic on Burde Street and congestion at the intersection of 10th Avenue and Burde Street.
- Street parking may increase similar to when A.D.S.S. occupied the site.
- Concerned about the condition and maintenance of Burde Street during construction. The dust, dirt and traffic have been horrible in the past and he hopes that care will be taken to mitigate a similar situation arising during this development.
- He is not opposed to development but would like to see the Multi-family building location shifted to a spot where it would have less impact on views. Possibly southwest corner of site.

Al Echlin of 16th Avenue expressed the following:

- 16th Avenue is a dead end street and traffic will increase with 18 new lots as vehicles must exit the street the same way they enter.
- Hopes that the street will be wide enough to handle increased traffic and that improvements will be made to 16th Avenue as part of the project requirements.
- Drainage and steep topography off 16th Avenue needs to be addressed.
- Views are beautiful from 16th Avenue and Council was asked to respect and consider that.

Bob Kanngiesser of Whittlestone Avenue expressed the following:

- The site is one of the last large developable sites within the city and urged Council to take a long term perspective on the city's needs.
- City needs diversity in housing choices but Mr. Kanngiesser is concerned that there is not an overall development plan for the entire site.
- Would like to see zoning applied to a portion of the site that would accommodate supportive housing or residential care facility.

5. Late Correspondence Regarding the Matter

1. Email dated December 1, 2017 from Dave Jarrett supporting the amendments and providing his own ideas for the site.

6. Questions from Council:

Councillor McLeman asked:

- a. Mr. Dulard to clarify his address and location on 14th Avenue.
- b. Who will build, own and manage the multi-family building? Brandon Crema (applicant) responded that they would build, retain ownership of and responsibility for the management of the building.
- c. How was the sun study done? B. Crema replied it was a software application.
- d. Expressed appreciation for local development in Port Alberni.

Councillor Paulson asked proponents to clarify their vision for the site and to address some of the concerns that had been expressed. He thanked them for their confidence in Port Alberni as a development opportunity.

B. Crema responded giving rationale for development at that location including low vacancy rates for rental accommodation. The availability of newer, more desirable, rental housing choices should result in more availability in older units which may help to address the need for affordable housing in the City. The proponents are planning a portion of the site to be developed with garden/patio homes equipped with RV parking which will meet demand from seniors who use RV's to travel south in the winter months. The proponents have met with several local groups advocating for seniors supportive housing and care options in Port Alberni. They are committed to developing the site as comprehensively as possible to meet local needs.

Mayor Ruttan asked:

- a. Will the North/South orientation of the multi-family building would mitigate sun shadow? B. Crema responded that it would.
- b. Will there be onsite parking? B. Crema responded "Yes".
- c. Will sidewalk extension continue from 14th Avenue east and south along 16th Avenue? B. Crema responded that is planned.
- d. How will developer address concerns about possible increase in traffic congestion at the intersection of 10th Avenue at Burde Street? B. Crema responded that a traffic study may be required but would not be necessary immediately.
- e. Has the developer done some due diligence to determine what geotechnical needs the site would require and has there been any evidence of sloughing on the site due to the fill and grade? B. Crema responded that a number of test holes had been sampled and the site is quite sound overall. There is no evidence of sloughing yet but the site is being monitored. It will be necessary to manage the deep soil in the fill areas.

Councillor Minions noted that rental apartments were a need in Port Alberni and asked the proponents what timeline they projected for this development. B. Crema responded that they would like to keep moving forward with subsequent required applications (Subdivision, Development Permit etc) and that they projected the development would take approximately two (2) years to complete.

Councillor Allemany asked:

- a. Will parking be surface? B. Crema responded that it would.
- b. Is there a plan to maintain greenspace as it can be very beneficial to people who are living in multi-family/townhomes? B. Crema responded that the plan was to maintain large trees where possible and also to work out details for parkspace dedication and trail continuity with City staff.
- c. Is there a plan to address need for affordable housing? B. Crema responded that they did not have an answer to that question today but that the plan does include room for a diversity of housing types and the developers will continue discussions with local advocates for seniors care and housing options.

Councillor Sauvé asked:

a. Is BC Housing involved with this development? B. Crema responded it was not.

7. Calling for any Further Input:

The Chair asked for any further input from the public. P. Milliken asked Council if the public would be able to provide further input in subsequent developments or bylaw amendments on the site. He was assured this would be the case.

The Chair called a second time for input. There was none.

The Chair asked for input for a third and final time. There was none.

8. Closing Remarks by the Chair:

The Chair made closing remarks on the matters of the public hearing.

It was moved and seconded: (Sauve / Washington)

That the Public Hearing terminate at 6:53 pm.

To Mayor and Council

Regarding the Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw amendments for 4000 Burde St.

I live at 3515 16th. Avenue, above the old high school fields, so I will be directly affected by the proposed changes.

This is an opportunity for the city to expand its housing inventory and tax base. While I will lose the green field across the road, and a certain amount of peace and quiet, I am not against the development of the land.

It is unfortunate that plans for multi-level care facilities "lost their way". Our aging population is in need of such services, our young people need jobs and our under-used college could train them in the required health care fields.

Why should both our old and our young be forced to leave town to continue their lives?

It occurs to me that at some point a new school may be needed in the centre of town. Development of housing on upper Burde Street and other places, coupled with the ageing of present structures may force this need sooner rather than later.

The plan for the property addresses other needs, such as multi-family units of different scales and densities. This leaves me cautiously hopeful that the developer, if successful, would stick to the plan displayed at the Advisory Planning Committee meeting and recognize the need to be aware of and respect the views of neighbours. Too much population density leads to problems for which, unfortunately, our city is already well known. I fear being sold on a plan I can live with, and ending up with something else.

However, I rank this plan as the fourth or fifth best outcome for the site, following:

- 1) The ideal leave all or part of it as green space it is becoming more and more heavily used as time passes for all kinds of activities.
- 2) The practical Institutional use for multi-level care for seniors. Employment opportunities, as well as the needs of older folk are met.
- 3) The long-term A new school. Now there's an idea!
- 4) The all-around best option A mix of all or some of the above, with the addition of mixed-level housing to create a "village feel".

5) The existing plan - as long as respect for aesthetics in planning and restraint in density are strictly observed.

There are engineering issues with drainage and slope on 16th. Avenue which must be noted at this time.

Water seeps from both cracks in the road and the slope down to the fields long after the rain stops and there are drainage problems along the block.

The road itself is subject to a lot of subsidence and is pock-marked with repairs. The slope down to the field seems to have changed slowly in angle in places.

The developer assured me that engineering work at the lot-preparation stage would take this into consideration and I want the city to be aware of these concerns. Preventive measures should be assessed by both the city and the developer to forestall potential problems to existing houses.

Applicant: Brandon Crema as agent for District Acquisitions Corporation

<u>Issue</u>

At issue is the consideration of an application for map amendments to the Official Community Plan (OCP) Bylaw, and to the Zoning Bylaw, for the property located at 4000 Burde Street.

Background

The applicant is proposing to develop the property in multiple phases that would accommodate a mix of residential uses with low density residential housing proposed along 16th Avenue in conjunction with different types of multi-family residential uses along the Burde Street and Anderson Avenue frontages. The first phase of the project involves a single family residential subdivision along 16th Avenue and an apartment building at the corner of Burde Street and Anderson Avenue.

The site is currently vacant and was formerly occupied by Alberni District Secondary School. It has been cleared and largely levelled although there are some significant grade areas on portions of the site. The site has \pm 271.8 metres (\pm 892 ft.) of frontage along Burde Street and is \pm 338.5 metres (\pm 1,110 ft.) deep, for a total site area of \pm 9.2 hectares (23 acres).

Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw

- a) Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at **4000 Burde Street**, is currently designated 'Institutional' on the Official Community Plan Schedule A Land Use Map. A map amendment is required to designate the property to a mix of 'Residential' and 'Multi-Family Residential' (see attached map).
- b) Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at 4000 Burde Street, is not included in a Development Permit Area on the Official Community Plan Schedule B Development Permit Area Map. A map amendment is required to include a portion of the property in Development Permit Area No. 1 Multi-Family Residential. The applicant will be required to apply for a Development Permit prior to receiving a building permit.

c) Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at 4000 Burde Street, is currently zoned 'P1 – Institutional' on the Zoning Bylaw Schedule - A Zoning Map. A map amendment is required to re-zone the property to a mix of 'P1 Institutional', 'R1 Single Family Residential' and 'RM3 High Density Multi-Family Residential' zones (see attached map).

Discussion

Surrounding Area

The property is located immediately to the north of the Dry Creek ravine and is bounded by Burde St. to the North, Anderson Ave. to the West, 16th Ave. to the East and North Park Dr. to the South. Immediately south of North Park Dr. is the Dry Creek forested ravine containing a recreational walking trail network. The immediate neighbourhood is generally single family residential, with several small multi-family buildings in the general area. There is a small coffee shop one block to the east on Burde Street

Official Community Plan

The application to amend the Official Community Plan is for the entire property, by designating the majority of the site as 'Multi-Family Residential' and a smaller portion designated as 'Residential'. The Multi-Family portion would be included in the Form and Character Development Permit Area No. 1 (Multi-Family Residential). The application to amend the Zoning bylaw is proposed to be in phases.

The applicant has submitted a preliminary 'Neighbourhood Plan' for the site (see attached). It shows the proposed first phase of the project and some preliminary ideas for the balance of the site. The southwest portion of the site shows some seniors housing with the centre of the property showing a townhouse complex. Other portions of the property are identified as future multi-family development.

Zoning

The current zoning on the property is 'P1 Institutional' and the applicant would like to rezone two portions of the property at this time. The rest of the property would remain zoned 'P1 Institutional' and would require additional zoning amendment applications for future development phases for the proposed multi-family use as applied for in the OCP amendment.

R1 Zoning

The applicant has applied to rezone $18,125 \text{ m}^2$ ($\pm 4.5 \text{ acres}$) at the southeast corner of the property, along 16^{th} Avenue to the 'R1 Single Family Residential' zone to facilitate a subdivision that would create eighteen (18) single family residential lots. The concept plan proposes that all the lots be accessed via two cul-de-sacs as shown on the attached plan. Each of the proposed single family lots exceeds the minimum 600 m^2 lot size required in the R1 zone.

There is a grade drop from 16th Avenue to the former field area where the two single family culde-sacs are proposed. The layout of the subdivision development is preliminary and will be revised as more detailed engineering work is completed during the subdivision process. Geotechnical engineering will be required where the subdivision involves slope areas.

The sanitary sewer main along 16th Avenue is too high to provide gravity service to the proposed single family subdivision. In order to provide gravity sanitary and storm sewer services to the single family development proposed off 16th Avenue, new services will need to be designed and installed through the property. The developer will be responsible for the design and installation of all services required for the project. The infrastructure services for the early phases must consider future phases of the project.

RM3 Zoning

The applicant is also requesting to rezone 7,052.2 m^2 (\pm 1.7 acres), at the northwest corner (intersection of Burde St. and Anderson Ave.) of the site, to the 'RM3 High Density Multi-Family Residential' zone. This portion of the site would have \pm 70.1 m of frontage along Burde Street. The 'RM3 High Density Multi-Family Residential' zone has a minimum frontage requirement of 30 metres (98.4 ft.). The minimum lot area requirement is 1,120 m^2 (12,056 ft²). The maximum site coverage in the RM3 zone is 50%. This portion of the site exceeds the frontage and lot size requirements of the RM3 zone.

A four storey, sixty-two (62) unit, multi-family residential apartment building is proposed for the RM3 portion of the site. The applicant has indicated that the proposed apartment building will consist of rental units which are needed in Port Alberni.

The capability of the existing infrastructure for the apartment building will need to be proven out by the developers' engineer and approved by the City Engineering department.

The Official Community Plan policy states that the City will consider the following criteria for new areas for multi-family development:

- Should be within walking distance (approx. 800 m) of commercial, recreational, public/institutional nodes, or community scale parks;
- Should be located on or in proximity to major collectors or arterial roads in order to reduce traffic impacts on local roads; and
- An adequate transition between lower density housing and compatibility with adjacent land uses must be provided.

There is a commercial hub located at Redford Street and 10th Ave. which is within the 800 metre radius of the site. Dry Creek Park and Recreation Park are also within that radius and would provide access to trails and recreational amenities such as Curling Rink, playground, tennis, lacrosse and ballfield facilities. There is a small park (Kiwanis Park) on 16th Avenue, just north of the Burde Street. Kiwanis Park has a small spray park and playground. The playground equipment is old and should be replaced. It is recommended that the Development Cost Charge fee from the first phase of the project be used to replace the playground equipment in Kiwanis Park.

Burde Street is designated as a collector road, as is Anderson Avenue and 15th Avenue from Burde Street to Redford Street. 10th Avenue and Redford Street are designated as arterial roads.

Good architectural design and landscaping will need to be considered during the Development Permit process to ensure compatibility with the existing neighbourhood.

The applicant has submitted a Sun Study diagram (see attached) to demonstrate the potential shadow effect from the proposed apartment building. With the exception of early morning and late afternoon in December the shadow from the apartment building will not extend onto neighbouring properties and therefore have very limited impact. This type of analysis will be

required to be repeated once the final design of the building has been determined during the Development Permit process.

On-street Parking

There is some on-street angle parking on a portion of Burde Street and Anderson Avenue where the proposed apartment building is located. This angle parking on the street was used when the former secondary school was in operation. This angle parking should be addressed by requiring it to be removed and replacing it with a wider pedestrian sidewalk more suitable for the intended multi-family development. This requirement would be addressed during the Development Permit process.

Infrastructure and Servicing

Water: There are water mains running along Burde St. and along 16th Ave.

Storm: Main is located along Anderson Ave. adjacent to the site.

Sewer: Sanitary sewer mains run adjacent to the property along 16th Ave., Burde St. and

Anderson Ave.

Private

Utilities: There are overhead private utilities along the Burde St. frontage at property line. Overhead utility poles run down Anderson Ave. on the west side of Anderson. Along 16th Ave. there are no overhead utilities. BC Hydro: Southeast corner has no BC Hydro service ability currently. The Northwest corner can be overhead or underground as dip from the former school still exists. Shaw Cable: The portion of the parcel to become RM3 will be straightforward for Shaw. All services will have to come from Burde Street. The R1 section will take a fair bit more planning/off site work to get Shaw services to this area.

The detailed issues regarding all servicing requirements for the single family subdivision will be addressed during the subdivision process and included in a Preliminary Layout Approval letter to the applicant. The details for the apartment building will be considered during the Development Permit process. The engineering for the first phases of this project shall be required to consider future development of the balance of the property. All engineering submissions will be reviewed and approved by the City Engineering department.

Traffic Signalization at Burde St. and 10th Ave.

The intersection of Burde Street and 10th Avenue has been historically busy due to traffic generated by the former secondary school. Although the school is no longer located in the vicinity there are several newer large subdivisions at the east end of Burde Street that have contributed to increased traffic in the area and more subdivision activity is anticipated. The first phase of the proposed development will also increase traffic and a portion of the traffic will need to use the un-signalized intersection of the 10th Avenue and Burde Street. As traffic increases there may be a need to install a traffic signal at this intersection. If approved, and once the first phase of this project is constructed, the City of Port Alberni will need to monitor this intersection. A traffic study for the immediate area, specifically studying the need for a traffic signal at 10th Avenue and Burde Street, should be required with an application for future phases of this property.

Trail Network

Council Policy included in the OCP:

"Ravines, watercourses and riparian areas will be preserved in their natural state, and wherever possible, will be linked to other park spaces or natural areas to create a comprehensive network of green space. Trail opportunities within these areas may also be considered when not detrimental to the environment."

The City trail network includes a small section of trail that runs from the end of 16th Avenue along the top of Dry Creek ravine (City owned) to the track area of the former high school. A connection through the development to Anderson Avenue will be required. It is also recommended that future phases include pedestrian corridors that will connect with the City trail network. There is an existing treed area on the property that includes some steep slope sections. Any proposed alteration to this area will require a Geotechnical Engineer and may need to be covered by a restrictive covenant.

Status of the Application

At the November 2, 2017 meeting of the Advisory Planning Commission the following motions were carried:

- 1. That the Advisory Planning Commission recommends to City Council that the City proceed with a map amendment to the Official Community Plan Schedule A Land Use Map to change the designation of Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at 4000 Burde Street, from 'Institutional' use to a mix of 'Residential' and 'Multi-Family Residential' use.
- 2. That the Advisory Planning Commission recommends to City Council that the City proceed with a map amendment to the Official Community Plan Schedule B Development Permit Areas Map to include a portion of Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at 4000 Burde Street, in 'Development Permit Area No. 1 Multi-Family Residential'.
- 3. That the Advisory Planning Commission recommends to City Council that the City proceed with a map amendment to the Zoning Bylaw (Schedule A Zoning Map) to change the designation of Lot 1, District Lot 46, Alberni District, Plan 11651, (PID: 004-971-418), located at 4000 Burde Street, from 'P1 Institutional' to a mix of 'P1 Institutional', 'R1 Single Family Residential' and 'RM3 High Density Multi-Family Residential' zones.
- **4.** That the Advisory Planning Commission recommends to City Council that as part of the development process the applicant be required to complete the following before final adoption of the bylaw:
 - a. Receive a Preliminary Layout Approval from the Subdivision Approving Officer

At the November 14, 2017 regular meeting, City Council received and accepted the APC recommendations and gave 1st and 2nd reading to Official Community Plan Amendment No. 25 (4000 Burde Street – District Acquisitions Corp.), Bylaw No. 4952 and Zoning Bylaw Map Amendment No. 27 (4000 Burde Street – District Acquisitions Corp.), Bylaw No. 4953.

Conclusions

In considering the Zoning amendment, City Council should consider whether the proposed amendment is appropriate for the site and for the community.

The proposal would amend the Official Community Plan by designating the majority of the site as 'Multi-Family Residential' and a smaller, remaining portion as 'Residential'. Amendments to the Zoning bylaw are proposed to be phased. The applicant has applied to first rezone 18,125 m² (± 4.5 acres) at the southeast corner of the property, along 16th Avenue to the 'R1 Single Family Residential' zone to facilitate a subdivision that would create eighteen (18) single family residential lots. In addition, the applicant has requested to rezone 7,052.2 m² (± 1.7 acres), at the northwest corner (intersection of Burde St. and Anderson Ave.) of the site to the 'RM3 High Density Multi-Family Residential' zone to facilitate the development of a four storey, sixty-two (62) unit, multi-family residential apartment building.

The City of Port Alberni will need to work with the developer to ensure that early phases of the project allow for cohesive development of future phases of the overall site. The proposed locations for first phase of the single family residential subdivision and the apartment building will not negatively impact future development opportunities. Depending on proposals for future phases a more comprehensive Neighbourhood Plan will be required.

The Official Community Plan is supportive of encouraging development within existing developed areas through infill and redevelopment. The proposed bylaw amendments are compatible with the neighbourhood and the Development Services Department supports amending the bylaws.

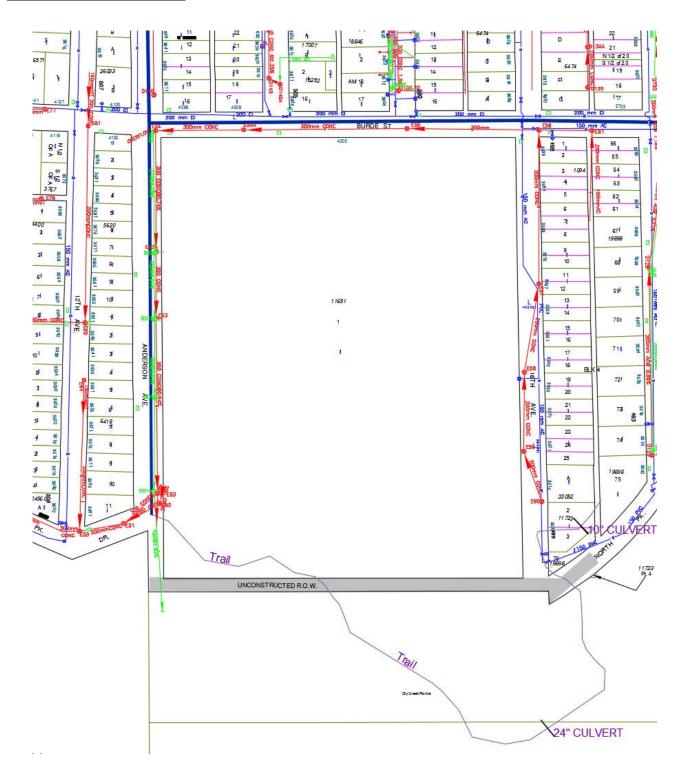

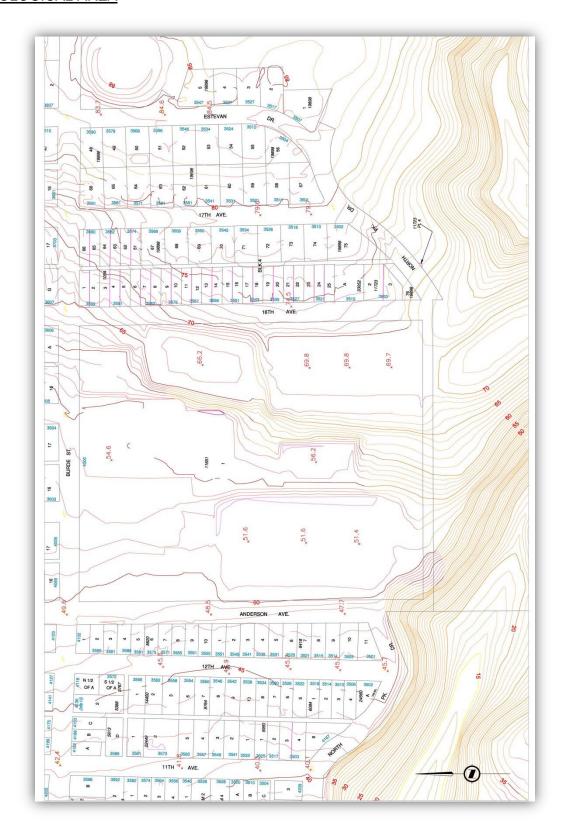
SUBJECT PROPERTY - 4000 BURDE STREET



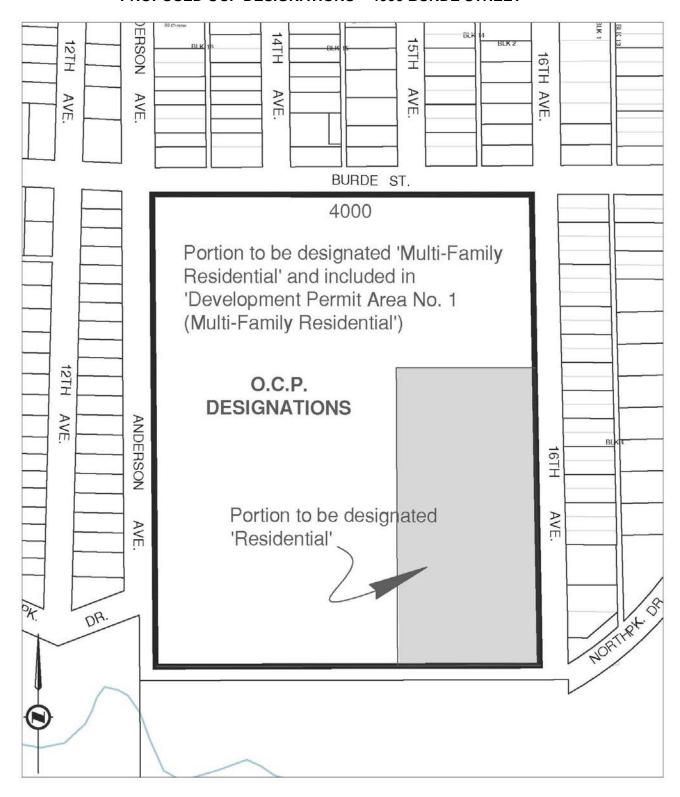
AREA INFRASTRUCTURE



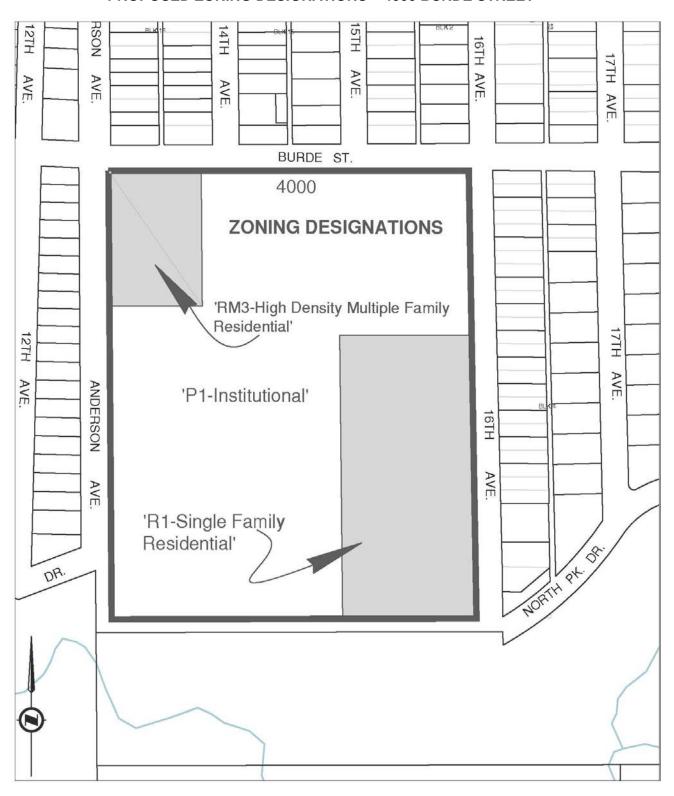
TOPOLOGICAL AREA

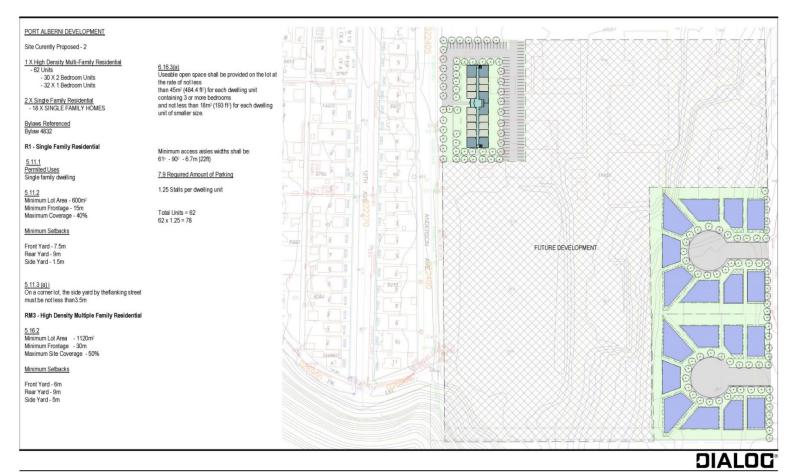


PROPOSED OCP DESIGNATIONS - 4000 BURDE STREET



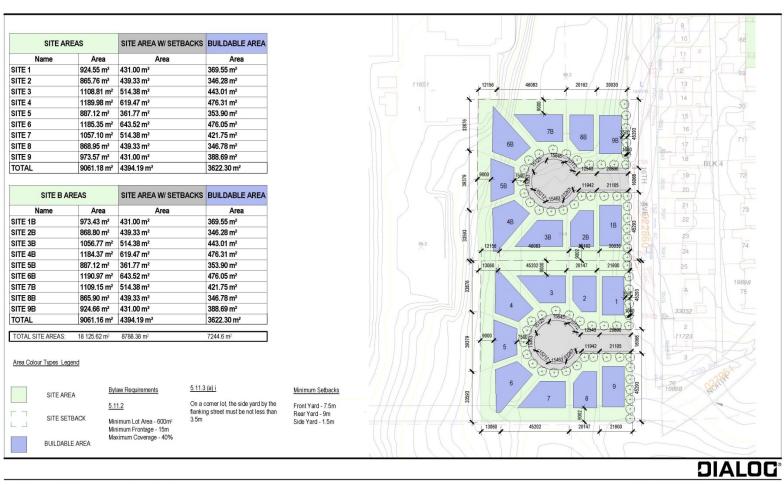
PROPOSED ZONING DESIGNATIONS - 4000 BURDE STREET





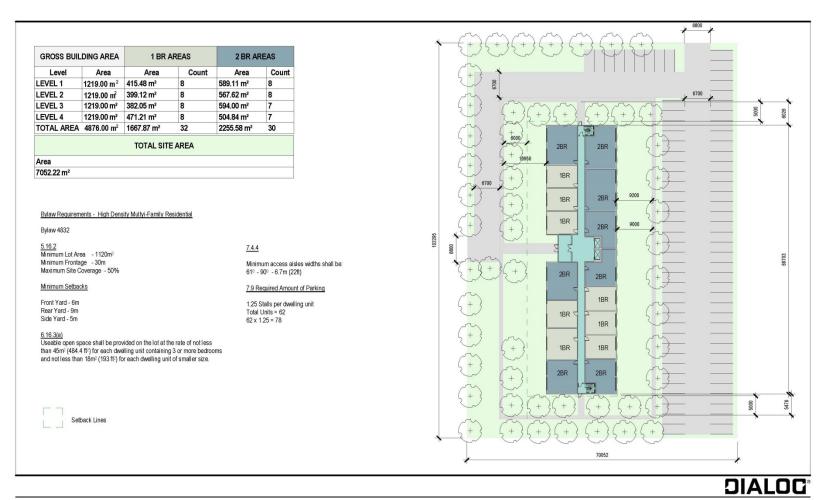

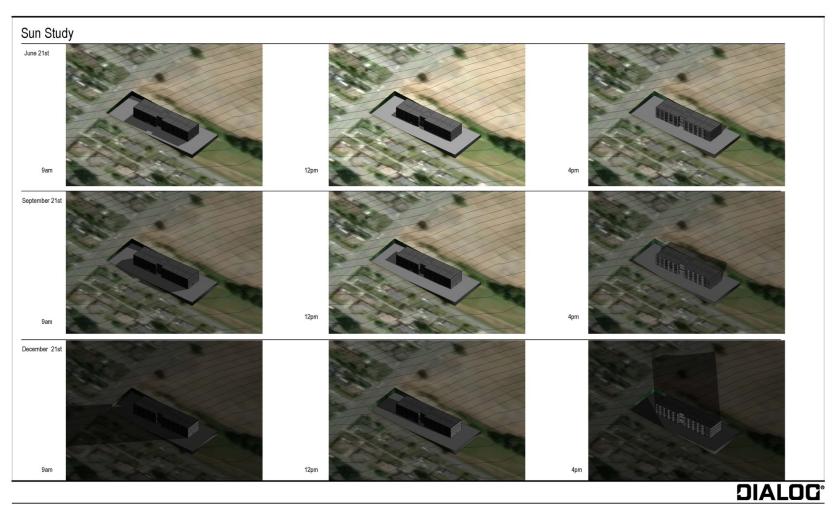


PROJECT TITLE: PORT ALBERNI - SCHEMATIC PLANS PROJECT #:

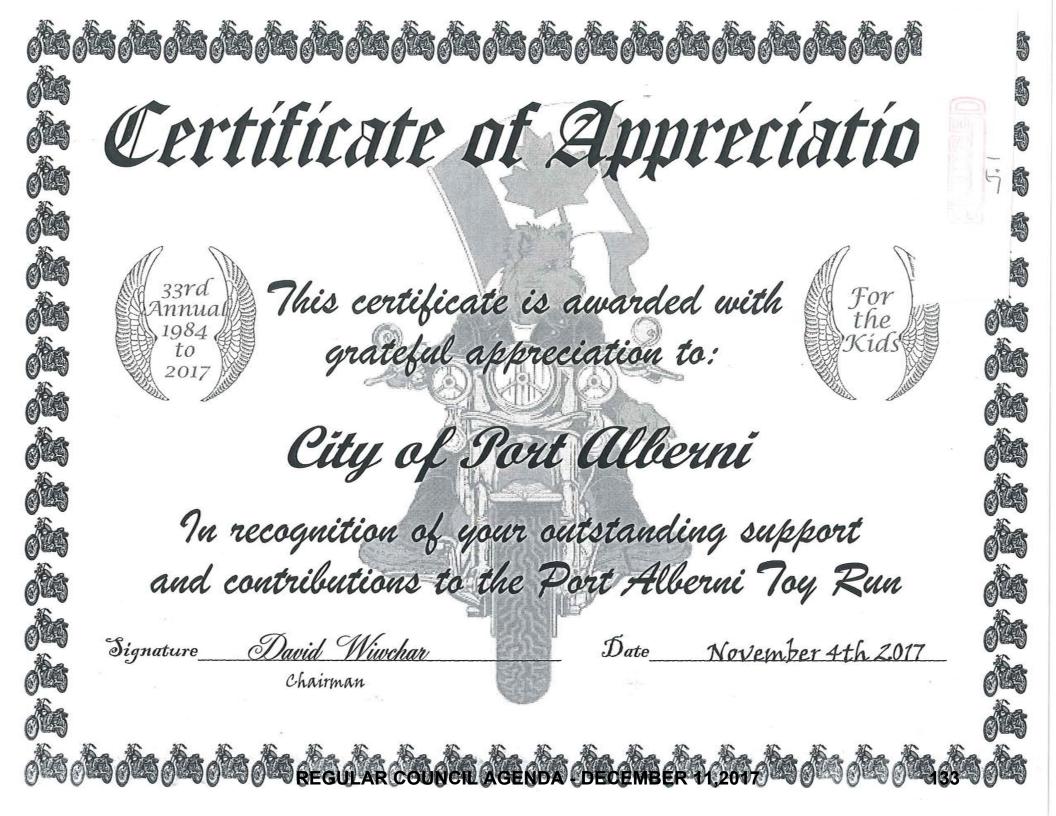

November 23rd, 2017 marks the completion of Habitat for Humanity Mid-Vancouver Island's Meadow Hill Development with the Unit 5 and 6 Dedication Ceremony.

Justin, Bianca and their children Nevaeh and Bristol are the new Habitat homeowners of Unit 6, a three bedroom home. Justin and Bianca have been paying high rent for an old house which has humidity issues causing mold, mildew and an infestation of silverfish throughout the house. The rental is cold as well, so running heaters and dehumidifiers creates a large hydro bill. The conditions inside the house cause health issues and frequent colds for both children. Moving into their new Habitat home will mean that Justin, Bianca and their children will live in a safe, healthy, affordable home.

Pam and her daughter Kaitlyn are the new Habitat homeowners of Unit 5, a two bedroom, disability-accessible home. Special provisions and upgrades to the house were provided to allow Kaitlyn, who is in a power chair, to have independence to move around the house on her own. 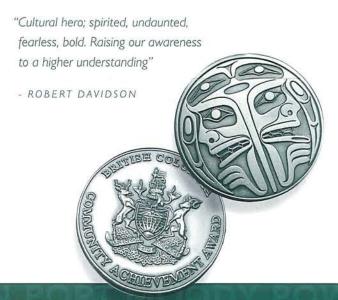

Open Correspondence To the Attention of the Tofino Mayor and Council

Since my presentation as a delegate in November 2011 to Mayor Perry Schmunk and the still current Councillors, Al Anderson, Cathy Thicke, Duncan McMaster, Dorothy Baert and Ray Thorogood I have endeavored to inform and educate on the subject of the non-thermal effects of electro magnetic radiation (EMR) and Radio Frequency Radiation (RF). I covered this subject over a period of many comprehensive monthly updates on the topic of "smart meters" in particular but all was relevant to EMR and RF harm. You may recall I discussed the hazardous bio-impacts on female and male reproductive organs, fetuses in the womb, and the much thinner skulls and rapidly dividing cells of infants and children. The birds, bees, amphibians and other wildlife are known to be even more vulnerable to this pollution because of their rapid metabolisms and much smaller body mass. This wildlife is disappearing in abnormal numbers.

Every concern I cited in these regular reports has come to pass and was sufficient knowledge to provide Council with the foresight to be cautious with and about EMR infrastructure when the need arose.

On or about last January, 2017 Telus approached the current council behind closed doors in an "open camera" session, requiring the signing of a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) which I believe is contrary to the Community Charter. What this tactic did however was provide Telus with protection of the available, but corporately one sided, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) wall of secrecy. This should never have been accepted by Council and has deprived the residents of their community with Council transparency.

What I present, and in many instances repeat, to the Mayor and Council are more than sufficient objective reasons for concern that should be reiterated to Telus in order to refuse the proposed installation of a cell tower just outside of our town. The information I am providing still remains "the tip of the iceberg" of the scope of this subject.

What is Safety Code 6? Thermal vs. Non-Thermal Radiation

Safety Code 6 (SC6) was created in 1966 for federal employees and visitors long before Wi-Fi and cellular phones and cell phone towers existed and has not had any mayor revisions in over 30 years. It is based solely on the effects of and safety from the effects of thermal radiation and therefor has no relevance in any argument defending non-ionizing (non-thermal) radiation health concerns, yet it still remains the only excuse used by those who defend the safety of wireless technology.

I have permission once again to quote the highly reputable and knowledgable Mr. Jerry Flynn in comprehensively answering this question. His biography is attached as a separate document.

Firstly some clarification by definition:-

- a) 'Radiation,' in this context, means 'energy' in the form of electric and magnetic fields (EMFs) which travels at the speed of light. This radiation is categorized by its frequency, i.e., <u>Radio</u> Frequency (RF) or <u>Extremely Low</u> Frequency (ELF) electromagnetic field (EMF) radiation. RF EMF (which includes microwave frequencies) is emitted by all wireless radio products/devices baby monitors, Smart meters, 'smart' appliances, cell phones, cordless phones, cell phone towers, Wi-Fi routers, Bluetooth, tablet and laptop computers, PCs, Wi-Fi and Wi-MAX zones, AM and FM radio and TV towers, Amateur Radio towers, CB radios, etc. ELF (also known as Powerline (60 Hz) Frequency) EMF, is present in anything in which 60 Hz electricity flows, e.g., overhead power transmission and distribution lines, substations, power transformers, 'smart' meters, household electricity and appliances, electric vehicles, tools, machinery, etc.
- b) Thermal vs <u>non-thermal</u> EMFs. Both ELF and RF technologies emit <u>non-thermal</u> EMFs, i.e., radiation which does not heat the skin and cannot be detected by the body's own senses (sight, smell, taste, hear or touch)! Because Health Canada and their equally corrupt colleagues refuse to acknowledge / admit that there are harmful <u>non-thermal</u> effects to EMF, this gives a 'green light' to Industry to freely manufacture and sell their extremely profitable but hazardous electrical and wireless products to an ignorant, trusting and helpless public, or use it themselves (referring to 'smart' meters, which are fraught with hazards, not just radiation).

Protectors of 'Public Health and Safety in Canada'

In British Columbia, as in all jurisdictions throughout Canada, people rely on the Provincial Health Officer (PHO) and Health Canada to protect them from ELF and RF EMFs. BC's PHO (who has been BC's PHO since the position was established, in 1999). This man lacks any meaningful education or qualifications in this highly specialized field, leaving him no recourse but to simply echo whatever corrupt Health Canada says on any aspect of non-ionizing radiation, thermal or <u>non-thermal</u>. This means that British Columbian's, like the entire population of Canada, are now – and have always been - at the sole mercy of a corrupt Health Canada Radiation Protection Bureau, which only supports industry!

<u>Note</u>: Municipal and Regional Governments need to realize that Health Canada, like its equally corrupt colleagues in the other so-called International Regulatory Agencies will not publicly acknowledge or admit that:

- a. ELF EMFs are harmful to humans (HC follows the irresponsibly high and extremely dangerous recommendations of ICNIRP (See Annex A)).
- b. RF EMFs produce <u>non-thermal</u> effects which are known to be biologically harmful to humans and their health; and,

c. There exists a serious debilitating condition known today as electrohypersensitivity or "EHS." First discovered by German scientists in 1932, scientists now say that it afflicts 5%–10% of the world's entire population!

Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISEDC)

While health and public safety are not part of ISEDC's mandate, it is inexcusable, reprehensible and, in this writer's view, criminal beyond belief, that ISEDC allows Industry to use that portion of the radio spectrum which, in 1994, the US Military stated was: "The most dangerous to humans as they (these frequencies) penetrate all organ systems of the body and therefore put all organ systems at risk (specifically mentioning 1-5 GHz)"! [14] Also, Robert C. Kane, a senior Motorola scientist, who died from brain tumor (prompting him to sue Motorola, albeit unsuccessfully, said that frequencies 700 MHz to 1 GHz interact most efficiently with human tissue to yield the greatest energy absorption. [15]

In closing, municipal governments now know that, since the 1960s, Health Canada's Radiation Protection Bureau has allowed itself to be 'captured' by the US military and electric power utilities and telecommunications companies! Municipal governments now realize that B.C.'s PHO is totally unqualified – and therefore - incapable of protecting the public from EMFs (both ELF and RF)! Worse still, since 1999, he has accepted, defended and echoed whatever Health Canada has said about the alleged 'safety' of both ELF and RF EMF! Knowing this, and recalling that, in 2011, the Government of BC signed a 10-year, potentially \$1-Billion contract with Telus Corp for the latter to upgrade the province's telecommunications, every person in B.C. should be extremely concerned for their and their family's health and safety! They should also be outraged to know that governments – at all levels - have betrayed them! In effect, the Government of BC has given Telus a 'green light' to install wireless technology in all government buildings, including cancer clinics, hospitals, schools, etc.!

Time is rapidly running out! Local governments must act NOW and QUICKLY to educate themselves about the potential hazards of "5G" (fifth generation) technology, which the telecom industry is poised to install across the province. In fact, Tofino is reported to already have it installed by Mascon! These new, much higher 5G microwave frequencies have never been independently tested to prove they will not cause adverse biological and/or health effects to people! Local governments must realize that, by allowing telecom companies to install "5G" technology, they are stripping themselves of any authority they currently have as to where and how many microcell towers and/or transmitters can be placed! Lastly, it should be noted that the US military uses similar microwave frequencies in their electronic warfare weapons for crowd control; these frequencies can burn the skin, causing excruciating pain!"

Non-Thermal effects are much more numerous and biologically significant. Health Canada has admitted in Court testimony that their Safety Code 6, and it's scope had not regarded non-thermal effects at all. However, in the European Union non-thermal effects have been extensively examined for more than 10 years through their Council, after parliamentary committee research, as well as observed by tens of thousands of medical practitioners in dozens of countries from their diagnosis of their patients). As a result, the European guidelines, since 2011, have established an exposure limit of 0.1 microwatt/cm², contrary to Canada's Safety Code 6 which remains at 600.0 to 1,000 microwatts/cm². What do they know that Canada has ignored?

The Health Canada did however determine that 36 studies were of "sufficient quality for inclusion in the Risk Assessment of Safety Code 6" in the following categories:"

- Cancer is linked in 6 studies,
- Brain/nervous system impacts in 13,
- Biochemical disruption in 16 and
- Development and/or learning behaviour impacts in 7.

However all requests for a public disclosure of the "Weight of Evidence" criteria used to dismiss these studies have been ignored by Health Canada in favour of industry funded studies. All of these studies, along with two requested scientific reports disputing Safety Code 6, were dismissed by Health Canada without showing cause.

This is a long and tedious read but by going to the site one will notice how comprehensive Health Canada's evaluation process is totally corrupt.

Health Canada wasted over \$100,000.00 of Taxpayers money. The Royal Society (RSC) Report is not an independent review.

- The RSC Expert Panel was conflicted; half of the panel members have strong financial ties to industry.
- The original Royal Society panel chair resigned only after the CMAJ reported an undisclosed conflict of interest.
- The RSC invited Dr. Anthony Miller and Dr. Martin Blank as peer reviewers of the report. Their input challenging the report results was ignored.

Cell Phone Tower Health Concerns

The safety of cell phone towers has been the subject of extensive scientific debate for years. Health concerns are becoming more prevalent and a there is fast growing body of scientific evidence that the electromagnetic radiation they emit, even at low levels, is dangerous to human health. Yet the Canadian cell phone industry is expanding quickly, with over 13,000 cell phone towers now up across the country. This is expected to increase ten-fold over the next five years. The industry has set what they say are "safe levels" of radiation exposure, but there are a growing number of doctors, physicists, and health officials who strongly disagree, and foresee a public health crisis. These towers emit radio frequencies (RF), electromagnetic radiation (EMR), for a distance of up to 4 kilometers. (Yet Telus has only handed out notices to residents within 200 meters of the proposed site.) They are essentially the same frequency radiation as microwaves in a microwave oven. Studies have shown that even at low levels of this radiation, there is evidence of damage to cell tissue and DNA, and it has been linked to brain tumours, cancer, suppressed immune function, depression, miscarriage, Alzheimer's disease, and numerous other serious illnesses. [1]Children are at the greatest risk, due to their thinner skulls, and rapid rate of growth. Also at greater risk are the elderly, the frail, and pregnant women. 100 physicians and scientists at Harvard and Boston University Schools of Public Health have called cellular towers a radiation hazard. And 33 delegate physicians from 7 countries have declared cell phone towers a "public health emergency". With an explosively emergent \$45 billion dollar a year industry at stake in North America, critics have stated telecommunications companies studies are going to show whatever they want them to show"

Our federal government a.k.a. Health Canada also once told us that asbestos, cigarettes, thalidomide, and the blood supply were "safe", which were later found to be harmful. You can bet that their studies are going to show whatever they want them to show.

The current Canadian standard for radiation exposure from cell phone towers is 600 -1,000 microwatts per sq. cm. (mW/cm²). This remains among the least protective in the world. More progressive European countries have set standards 100 to 1,000 times lower than Canada. Compare Australia at 200 microwatts, Russia, Italy, China at 6, and Switzerland, at 4. In Salzburg, Austria the level is .1 microwatts (pulsed), 10,000 times less than Canada. New Zealand has proposed yet more stringent levels, at .02 microwatts, 50,000 times more protective than Canada. Contrary to what the communications industry tells us, there is vast scientific, epidemiological and medical evidence that confirms that exposure to the RF and microwave radiation emitted from cell towers, even at low levels, can have profound adverse effects on biological systems.

The world's leading electromagnetic researchers say existing scientific knowledge is inadequate to set reliable exposure standards. – The Vienna Resolution, 1998
The Salzburg Resolution, adopted in 2000 at the International Conference on Cell Tower Siting, would prohibit any cell site from emanating more than .1 mW/cm² – 10,000 times more strict than the current Canadian standard. This limit takes into account the growing evidence for non-thermal RF bioeffects. Cell phone towers expose the public to involuntary, chronic, cumulative Radio Frequency Radiation. Some scientific studies show adverse health effects reported in the .01 to 100 mW/cm² range at levels hundreds, and thousands of times lower than Canadian standards.

Harmful low levels of radiation can reach as far as a 2 kms. away from the cell tower location. Reported health problems include headache, sleep disorders, memory impairment, nosebleeds, an increase in seizures, blood brain barrier leakage problems, increased heart rates, lower sperm counts, and impaired nervous systems.

Long term and cumulative exposure to cell tower radiation has no precedent in history. There are no conclusive studies on the safety of such exposures, and the growing body of scientific evidence reports such bioeffects and adverse health effects are possible, if not probable. Type in "cancer clusters around cell phone towers" on Google Search and see how many hits you

Dr. Neil Cherry, Ph.D. biophysicist from New Zealand, reports that "There is no safe level of EMR radiation." The European requirement of using the "Precautionary Principle" is completely ignored in North America. It's all about control and the bottom line profits. Social responsibility is ignored.

Dr. Cherry also states that standards are based on thermal effects, but important non-thermal effects also take place, such as cell death and DNA breakdown. Dr. Cherry wrote a 120-page review of 188 scientific studies. "The electromagnetic radiation causes cells to change in a way that makes them cancer forming." It can increase the risk of cancer two to five times, he said. "To claim there is no adverse effect from phone towers flies in the face of a large body of evidence." – Dr. Neil Cherry, biophysicist. Just one more of many around the world.

"Our bodies are exquisitely sensitive to subtle electromagnetic harmonics, and we depend upon tiny electrical impulses to conduct complex life processes," says Dr. Robert Becker, author of "The Body Electric" and "Cross Currents The Perils of Electropolution". He says "at the present the greatest polluting element in the earth's environment is the proliferation of (these) electromagnetic fields." Radiation once considered safe, he says, is now correlated with increases in birth defects, depression, Alzheimer's disease, learning disabilities, Chronic FatigueSyndrome, and cancer. The incidence of brain cancer is up 25% since 1973, and this year 185,000 Americans will be diagnosed with brain cancer. Brain tumours are the second leading cause of cancer death for children and young adults. Yet, the United States has a de facto policy of "post sales surveillance" with respect to RF radiation. Only after years of exposure, will there be studies to characterize the health consequences. Some adverse health effects show up immediately, but it can often take 3 to 10 years for the longer term effects of RF illness to appear, such as cancer. Many researchers, public health officials and citizens believe that consumers shouldn't be forced to act as guinea pigs in a bioeffects experiment for the next 20 years. In short, "we are the experiment", for health effects. Dr. Gerard Hyland, physicist, says existing safety guidelines for cell phone towers are completely inadequate, since they focus only on the thermal effects of exposure. Hyland says existing safety guidelines "afford no protection" against the non-thermal influences. "Quite justifiably, the public remains skeptical of attempts by governments and industry to reassure them that all is well, particularly given the unethical way in which they often operate symbiotically so as to promote their own vested interests." "Existing safety guidelines for cell phone towers are completely inadequate." - Dr. Gerard Hyland, Physicist is a two-time nominee, Nobel Prize in Medicine.

The studies available are unending. 70% of all non-industry studies on cell tower installations point to a health hazards that our three levels of government are forcing upon us. We cannot turn it off; we cannot escape it short of living in the wilderness. We are guinea pigs. We must fight this if we are to have any future for ourselves and our future generations. We are being deprived of our fundamental rights.

Their negotiations with a Tofino landowner for the construction of their tower was done with subterfuge and relied on ignorance and greed to cajole a potential agreement from them to the extreme detriment of the other 1800+ residents.

My expectations of the Mayor and Council are to:

1) Immediately postpone any decision.

- 2) Retain legal council familiar with the due process of this situation and have a notice sent to Telus.
- Contact the uninformed landowner who is jeopardizing the health and safety of our community including their own immediate and permanent depreciation of property value.
- 4) Advertise on the local radio station for 2 weeks encouraging residents attendance at a community meeting where independent speakers can properly explain the situation and have questions answered by those with the knowledge base to do so.
- 5) Conduct a plebiscite.
- 6) Establish bylaws covering the citing of future microcells (5G) and any other telecommunication devices and towers.

In summation, we do not need another cell phone tower in this community for the sake of a few people who may even have legitimate complaints. We don't need faster service. We certainly want to run away as fast as we can from 5G.

We need sustainable health for the people of our community above all else. This is the Mayor and Councils duty to provide. Anything less should be considered dereliction of duty both in office and personally.

Jerry Flynn - Biography

I am a retired Canadian Armed Forces captain (commissioned from the ranks) who spent 22 of my 26+ years in Canada's military in the arcane fields of Electronic Warfare (EW) and Signals Intelligence (SIGINT). My security clearance was "Top-Secret (code word)". My most relevant appointments included: two years in National Defense Headquarters in the Directorate of Electronic Warfare (DEW), where I was the sole EW officer charged with supporting Canada's only army EW Company. For two years I worked closely with U.S. and NATO army EW units and completed, at my own initiative, a lengthy NATO army EW officers' course in Anzio, Italy. Later, I participated in a major NATO army EW officers' field exercise in Germany (again, at my own initiative). While in DEW I accepted invitations to visit the U.S. Pentagon and, separately, Fort Bragg, N.C., the U.S. Army's major EW base. My previous two-year posting was back in the SIGINT world, for which I was personally contacted and asked if I would assume the duties of both Executive Officer and Operations Officer at one of Canada's largest and most sensitive SIGINT radio stations. Here approximately 200 specially trained radio intercept operators conducted either COMINT or ELINT under my direction. Throughout this period I worked closely with the USA's NSA and, to a lesser degree, with Britain's GCHQ. Earlier in my career I conducted Radio Warfare (today's EW) at sea aboard two Canadian warships whose common home base was Esquimalt, BC. For six months in 1960, I operated the world'most northerly HAM radio station: VF8TU.

Testimony of Mr. Frank Clegg, CEO, C4ST, Canadians For Safe Technology Before the Standing Committee on Health Studies for Health Canada April 28, 2015

Mr. Chair and committee members, I'd like to thank you for the invitation to speak with you this afternoon and for deciding to invest committee time on Safety Code 6.

When I ran the Canadian operations for Microsoft, I learned that it is critical to focus on process. Today, as a board member for Indigo Books and Music, my role has shifted more towards governance and oversight. In both roles, process is critical to success. Government is the largest corporation of all, so process is of paramount importance. As someone who regularly examines success and failure, I believe I can explain why the Safety Code 6 process is a failure by all metrics and has left Canadians unprotected.

There is a book written by Nassim Taleb called The Black Swan, a focus on very low-probability, high-impact events that aren't supposed to happen. Oil spills, train derailments, and airplane crashes are some of the events in this category. Taleb calls these "black swan" events.

If one decides that all swans are white and refuses evidence of black swans, then one will conclude that all swans are white. Black swans are rare, but they do exist. Unfortunately, experts convinced themselves that these events had zero probability. They did not plan appropriately and people died.

The American Academy of Environmental Medicine is an international organization of physicians and scientists that has predicted, among other things, the rise in multiple chemical sensitivity, which is now protected in many public policies. Regarding the unprecedented increase in wireless devices, the academy forecasts "a widespread public health hazard that the medical system is not yet prepared to address".

I believe Health Canada's analysis focuses on identifying and counting white swans, while ignoring black swan evidence. Health Canada's representative informed this committee on March 24:

...some of these studies report biological or adverse health effects of RF fields at levels below the limits in Safety Code 6, I want to emphasize that these studies are in the minority and they do not represent the prevailing line of scientific evidence in this area.

In other words, black swans exist.

In your handout—I don't know if you have it, as we put it in for translation—is a document entitled "Analysis of 140 Studies Submitted by Canadians for Safe Technology (C4ST) During the Public Comment Period on Safety Code 6". A chart in that document shows that Health

Canada accepts that there are in fact 36 studies all passing Health Canada's quality criteria showing harm at levels below Safety Code 6.

As a Canadian, I find this confusing. As an executive, I find it inexcusable.

Of the 36 studies Health Canada deemed satisfactory, cancer is linked in six of them. In 13 of them, the brain and/or nervous system is disrupted. In 16 studies, Health Canada admits that biochemical disruption occurs. Finally, seven high-level scientific studies indicate an effect on intellectual development and/or learning behaviour. All of these studies show impacts with radiation below Safety Code 6 limits. How was this black swan evidence evaluated?

In our two-year investigation, C4ST has determined that Health Canada doesn't even have the proper software required to access, summarize, and analyze the large number of relevant studies. If our group of learned and qualified volunteers can uncover 140 studies, how many more are being missed or ignored?

Health Canada references its weight-of-evidence approach. It is unclear how many studies you need to outweigh 36 studies that show harm, especially to children. I just can't fathom why Health Canada is not highlighting these studies and prioritizing their implications. Despite requests to publish the weight-of-evidence criteria as per international standards, Health Canada refuses to do so. Even the recent 2015 rationale document does not provide this critical information.

Health Canada dismisses scientific evidence unless it shows harm where the microwave levels are strong enough to heat your skin. The notion that microwaves are not harmful unless they heat your skin is decades out of date. The core premise of this white swan dates back to Einstein's theory that non-ionizing radiation cannot cause harm, or if it does, it must heat tissue to do that. Albert Einstein passed away the same year Steve Jobs was born. To think that science has not evolved since then is classic white swan thinking. It's part of a process predetermined to fail.

Health Canada says on its website today that there is no chance that Wi-Fi or cellphones can harm you because it has studied all the science, but when pressed under oath, Health Canada officials give a more fulsome answer. In Quebec Superior Court in September 2013, Health Canada senior scientist James McNamee admitted that Health Canada only assesses risk based on the thermal effect, i.e., the heating of tissue.

Unfortunately, Canada has not invested the necessary time nor had the balanced opinion of experts necessary to undertake a proper review. Our research has uncovered that the Health Canada author of Safety Code 6 has published papers demonstrating his bias towards this topic.

In a few hours over three days, this health committee has spent more time speaking with scientific experts who believe there is harm from wireless radiation below Safety Code 6 than all of Health Canada combined. You can't find black swans when you don't talk to the experts who've identified them.

There is a fundamental business rule: you can't manage what you don't measure. It is clear that Health Canada not only doesn't follow that rule but even resists it. A memo obtained under access to information to the Minister of Health in March of 2012 revealed that Health Canada "does not support the recommendation to establish an adverse reaction reporting process specifically for RF exposures". The memo goes on to state that "consumer complaints...may be directed to...the web-based system...under the...Canada Consumer Product Safety Act". This is an inadequate solution and, I believe, a missed opportunity.

I refer you to the C4ST fact sheet. I think you have it. I'd like to highlight three examples from that fact sheet: Health Canada's Safety Code 6 is among the countries with the worst guidelines in the world; Canada has fallen behind countries such as France, Taiwan, and Belgium in protecting Canadians; and finally, Health Canada wasted over \$100,000 of taxpayers' money, as the Royal Society report is not an independent review.

Health Canada also states that Safety Code 6 is a guideline and that other organizations at the provincial and local levels of government are free to implement lower levels as they see fit; however, that's not the reality of what happens. We have witnessed school boards, power and water utilities, Industry Canada, and manufacturers depending on Health Canada's analysis, and frankly, abdicating to it. They don't perform their own analysis.

Safer solutions exist. There are several situations in Canada regarding cell towers where the proponents have voluntarily offered to restrict radiation exposure, in some cases to thousands of times less than Safety Code 6. There is a solution in lowa for smart meters that use a wired meter that provides a safer, more secure solution at a lower cost.

Given that our track record in North America is not successful regarding such products as tobacco, asbestos, BPA, thalidomide, DDT, urea-formaldahyde insulation, and many others, use of the precautionary principle of prudent avoidance should be recommended until the science proves beyond reasonable doubt that there is no potential for harm.

For the last three years, science has published a new study every month that shows irreparable harm at levels below Safety Code 6. That is why we're asking the committee to take three decisive steps.

First, conduct a national campaign to educate Canadians about methods to minimize exposure to RF radiation, ban Wi-Fi in day care centres and preschools, and ban the marketing of wireless devices to children.

Second, protect individuals who are sensitive to RF radiation by accommodating them with safer levels of wireless exposure in federal workplaces and federal areas of responsibility. Third, and finally, create an adverse reporting system for Canadians and a publicly available database to collect improved data regarding potential links between health effects and

exposure to RF radiation.

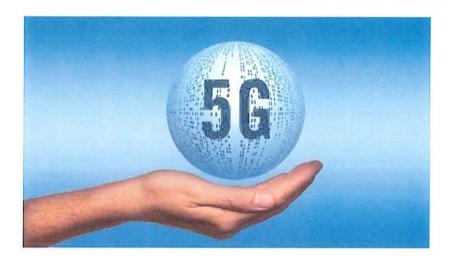
Parallel to the above, recommend that Health Canada conduct a comprehensive systematic review, subject to international standards, regarding the potential harmfulness of RF radiation to human health, with a scientific review panel that is balanced in opinion. It was a textbook case of black swan thinking that has led to this failure of Safety Code 6. (1555)

In conclusion, C4ST volunteers found 36 black swans that Health Canada agrees are high quality. How many would be available if Health Canada sincerely looked? Better yet, how many black swans will it take before Health Canada takes serious actions? Thank you very much.

5G Is An International Health Crisis In The Making

Recently, I came across one of the most comprehensive articles about 5G and the problems it will create for humankind (and all of creation) if and/or when 5G is rolled out across nations around the globe, which I thought my readers ought to know about.

[1] In 1968, US President Johnson, in his State of the Union Address, promised to protect the American people from the EMF (electro-magnetic field) radiation emitted by TV sets and other electronic equipment etc.! Yet, Health Canada (like the USA): a) refuses to recognize/admit that there are harmful health and biological non-thermal effects caused by RF EMF radiation; b) refuses to admit that today's wireless RF products / devices / toys all emit pulsed non-thermal radiation; c) refuses to acknowledge/admit that ELF (60 Hz) magnetic fields are harmful to people and other life forms; d) refuses to recognize/admit that there is such a condition known as "EHS" (electrohypersensitivity), which affects at least 3% of the world's entire population; and, e) has never once seen fit to make it mandatory for Industry to first prove – by qualified, non-industry scientists, replicating real-life applications – that the radiation emitted by wireless products / devices / toys is safe! Nor has Health Canada ever imposed the Precautionary Principle – even though the WHO (World Health Organization) itself stated – in 2003 – that there was sufficient evidence to justify its application (for both ELF and RF EMFs)! [10] Nor did Health Canada ever attempt to halt in any way the provinces, who each saw fit to mandate their electric utilities to

roll-out'smart' meters – even when the WHO subsequently classified RF EMFs a Class 2B or 'Possible' carcinogen, in 2011!

Governments' total disregard for the health and safety of the public has resulted in: 1) a growing host of disease epidemics, such as autism, ADHD, cancers, Alzheimer's Disease, Parkinson's Disease, ALS, and other diseases of the brain, central nervous system and immune system, which most people had not heard of before wireless technology appeared. [11] (These disease epidemics are now common in every jurisdiction on earth that has adopted wireless technology!); 2) homes / dwellings are now far more susceptible to break-ins, intrusions, and the threat of electrical fires – thanks to provincially-mandated 'smart' meters, which are unbelievably intrusive, invasive, hackable, fire-prone, and very expensive; and, 3) Canada's National Security is now at greater risk than at any previous time in our history, thanks to Government's irresponsible decision to incorporate 'smart' meters in Canada's national power grid!

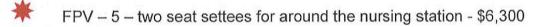
