### N. QUESTION PERIOD

#### **Roland Smith**

Q1: What are the costs related to the oil spill incident at McLean Mill to date, including but not limited to costs for contractors, City staff and bargaining unit employee time, fees for inspections and site attendance by government regulators, and so on?

Q2: Are there other expenses expected? If so, what are the estimated totals for those expenses?

Q3: Has the City received any financial assistance from its insurance provider that would help pay for the oil spill clean up? If so, how much financial assistance was received from the insurer?

Q4: An email message was sent by the City to the Honorable Jonathan Wilkinson, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, on December 23, 2020. That email message is referred to in the copy of a February 15, 2021 letter to Minister Wilkinson that appears in today's agenda. May I have a copy of the email message sent to the Minister on December 23, 2020?

Q5: Has the City explored any of the other government funding opportunities that would help pay for the oil spill at McLean Mill which were identified to the City during a conversation with the Acting National Historic Sites Manager? Would the City please identify which

opportunities were explored, and if any of those exploratory routes have resulted in any actual or anticipated financial assistance for the oil spill clean up costs?

Q6: It was July 6, 2020, or 8 months ago, that the Audit Committee last met. There are no dates scheduled for this committee to meet in the near term, according to the City's website. Good internal governance of any corporation includes oversight by a financial audit committee. Why has there been such a lapse by Council for this important function of public oversight of City expenditures, and when will the Audit Committee next meet?

Q7: When could the public expect to receive detailed fiscal 2020 financial data for McLean Mill operations?

Q8: The 2020 financial data should be presented by reports generated from accounting software. It was Council's requirement that the previous contractor at McLean Mill would report McLean Mill financial data for each fiscal year in this manner. Does Council intend to hold the current contractor to the same standard?

A: Staff will be providing a report to Council at a future meeting responding to Mr. Smith's questions.
