Hello, my name is Katrina. I have attached a letter I have written pertaining to a certain issue. Please let me know any information you may have. I am excited to make a positive change and learn a bit. Thank you!

I, Katrina Millington- Olorenshaw am writing to you today about a major traffic problem pertaining to the intersection of Gertrude St and Southgate Rd.

Over the past few months I have observed countless dangerous situations due to the high flow traffic in this area. I have come to the conclusion that having traffic lights put up, in all 4 directions would be extraordinarily beneficial, not only to traffic but the overall safety of this intersection.

Today, being July 17, 2015 after sitting astounded as to what I had been watching, I decided to watch for approximately 40 minutes; starting at about 2:10pm, to see how dangerous this intersection actually is and write down everything I noticed in that period.

In this time I saw countless amounts of vehicles disregarding stop signs, when turning right onto Gertrude St in either direction as if they were yield signs. I also saw approximately five pedestrians at separate times, barely able to cross safely while next to no vehicles stopped and drove through the intersection with zero regard for these pedestrians. Not to mention the amount of vehicles either trying to cross Gertrude St; or turn left onto Southgate Rd in either direction were faced with several blind spots and the dangers of large amounts of speeding vehicles in either direction.

The absolute most dangerous part of this intersection is the uncontrolled amount of speeding vehicles that are able to pass through between traffic lights. Being such a high traffic area for pedestrians and city transit as well, this is very terrifying and I see it on a daily basis. Even though there may be traffic lights only blocks away on either side, I feel it absolutely imperative to the safety of absolutely everyone that a traffic light, or another solution be considered for this immediate area.

I also have started speaking with random people about the topic and asking them what they thought. My one most common answer being that it has always been that bad. I am hoping to potentially meet with you and perhaps discuss this further to learn more about proper proceeding. Perhaps being able to have this on the agenda for the next council meeting in October.

Thank you for your time reading, I hope to hear from you soon on this matter.

I am disappointed this meeting has also been cancelled. I rescheduled my holiday to take in Oct 21 meeting. These are a few concerns to be put on the agenda

Alberni Elementary – 11/9/15 – The city put up no parking signs along Johnston 8-5 on school days so parents are not allowed to drop off children on a busy highway (SMART and long overdue) The city also put up 30 min. parking signs along the school field side of Helen St. Parents are initially annoyed on Alberni Elem. PAC facebook but have heard no other complaints

Wood Elementary - 16/09/15 – complaints of some high school students driving fast and ignoring people in the crosswalk in front of Wood school, typically before school 8:20-9:00. Also some traffic concerns during ADSS lunch hour along Wood Ave. Teachers taking license plate numbers and given to liaison officer

Larry Ransom (Trustee) received a concern from parents – inquiring about the practicality of a new crosswalk at 6th Ave and Roger St. This is to provide students walking to Alberni Elementary from the south side of Roger St safer access to the North side of Roger St. Apparently the south side of Roger is not a safe walk between 6th Ave and Stamp Ave intersection

Greg Smyth, superintendent of SD70 – has a great concern of the same intersection, 6^{th} and Roger, several motor vehicle accidents have occurred on that corner, at least 3 in the last few months.

Good morning Ken;

Along 10th Ave we have four intersection traffic configurations (for those with four legs)....

- Signalized (Roger, Wallace, Redford),
- Four-way stop (Argyle),
- Unsignalized with left turn slots (Bute, Burde, Dunbar), and
- Unsignalized without left turn slots (Hollywood, Cedarwood, Maitland, Morton, China Ck, Melrose, Bruce, Neill).

Maitland and 10th is likely the busiest unsignalized intersection without left turn slots along 10th Ave, although China Ck would be close in my opinion and has crosswalks on the north <u>and</u> south. Regardless of left turn slots, drivers passing along the right of turning vehicles need to be aware of pedestrians whether in crosswalks or not.

10th Ave width at 16 m would allow for provision of left turn slots but it may also impact parking on 10th Ave near the intersection.

We could bring this up at the next Advisory Traffic Committee meeting on November 4th.
