SUBJECT: BC Transit – Federal Election Polling Day

Issue:

Request for Council's consideration of providing free bus transportation on federal election polling day, October 19, 2015.

Background:

Issue

To consider the status of the proposed 21st Avenue arterial road routing in the Official Community Plan.

Background

City Council requested that staff provide a report on the proposed 21st Avenue arterial road route in the Official Community Plan. Although the proposed route is often referred to as a bypass, the City of Port Alberni has grown, and will continue to grow, towards the east. The proposed road would serve as a major north/south arterial road rather than a bypass.

As part of the 1981 Alberni Valley Transportation Network Plan (prepared jointly by the City, ACRD and Ministry of Highways), a major road along the east boundary of the City was proposed and adopted. In order to determine a preferred route for the 21st Avenue arterial road an Engineering study was completed by Stanley Consulting in 1998. The consultants considered a number of optional routes, developed relative costing for each option and provided a recommended "preferred route". Maps from the study, showing the preferred route, are attached for information. Both the Transportation Network Plan and the Stanley report can be reviewed on the City website in the documents library.

The previous Official Community Plan, adopted in 1993, had shown a major road along the east boundary of the City based on the 1981 Alberni Valley Transportation Network Plan. The current OCP, adopted in 2007, shows the preferred route from the Stanley report on Map 8: Major Road Network Plan. A copy of Map 8 from the OCP is attached and 21st Avenue is shown as a Green dashed line, labelled Proposed Bypass. An aerial photo showing the proposed route is also included for Council's information.

In addition to Map 8, Council Policy 8.1.4 in the OCP states as follows:

"North-south linkages are not well developed in the City due to topographic influences. Improved vehicular and pedestrian linkages are supported on the basis of more detailed transportation and environmental studies. Based on previous technical analysis, preference shall be given to the development of an east-side bypass as a major north-south road. Appropriate right-of-way will be acquired accordingly. Community need, based on such issues as traffic volumes, emergency access and/or development pressure will influence the construction timeframe."

The proposed 21st Avenue road is a long term transportation project. The road would be very expensive and the current traffic volumes do not warrant the construction of a major arterial road. Although this project is not warranted at this time, the City should consider and plan for long term transportation projects. Having long term transportation projects designated in the OCP is essential.

Based on the engineering study and the designation of 21st Avenue in the OCP, the City has, over the years, acquired road right-of-way as opportunities were presented along the proposed route. This project is a long term road network strategy and is not in the 5 year financial plan. However, a second Roger Creek crossing, which is a component of this route is an issue that has been raised by the community in recent years.

In 2013 the Alberni Clayoquot Regional District undertook a route study and conceptual design, for a ring road connecting Highway #4 and Franklin River Road. This study was completed by R.F. Binnie and Associates. The following four options were reviewed in the Binnie study providing for bypass routes further east of the City boundaries.

- Option 1 from Highway 4 to Cameron Main/Franklin River Road junction (see attached).
- Option 2 from Highway 4 to Franklin River Road, intersecting about 1 km south of Anderson Road (see attached).
- Option 3 a combination of option 1 and 2.
- Option 4 from Dundalk Road to Franklin River Road. This option was not reviewed in detail as it was determined not to be viable due to steep grades and the cost of crossing Rogers Creek.

Maps showing options 1 and 2 are attached for information and the cost estimates for two options range from \$17 to \$20 million. While the Binnie report has been received by the ACRD Board, none of the presented options have been endorsed or included in the ACRD's land use planning processes.

Discussion

Although the envisaged 21st Avenue arterial road and crossing of Roger Creek would allow for shorter commutes north and south in the City, there is no evidence that it is needed to resolve traffic congestion or volume problems at this time.

If the Ministry of Transportation or another group were to construct any of the ring road options studied in the ACRD's 2013 Binnie report, then the portion of 21st Avenue south of Redford Street may not be necessary. If one of the ring road options was to be constructed, it would be appropriate for the City of Port Alberni to consider connections to that ring road from Burde Street and Argyle Street. A Burde Street connection would be relatively close and would not involve any major creek crossings. The connection to Argyle Street would be much further and would require crossing tributaries of Dry Creek depending on final routing of a ring road. The construction of a ring road east of the City will not provide any improvement in traffic movement north to south within the City of Port Alberni.

Even if a ring road is undertaken by others outside the City boundaries, it is strongly recommended that the section of the proposed 21st Avenue arterial road from Redford Street to Johnston Road (Hwy. #4) stay in the OCP and remain designated as a long term transportation project. This section of 21st Avenue not only improves overall north/south connectivity, it connects three major transportation nodes. The hospital at the south terminus is not only a major traffic node, but 21st Avenue would also provide for faster emergency services from the north part of the City and Cherry Creek. The mall area at the north terminus includes the Alberni Mall, Pacific Rim Shopping Centre, No Frills and Wall Mart, which are all major traffic trip generators. A short connection to Roger Street from the 21st Avenue arterial road would provide for an easy access to the City of Port REGULAR COUNCIL AGENDA - SEPTEMBER 14, 2015

Alberni's major recreational facilities, North Island College and ADSS, which are also traffic generators.

Options

- 1. Leave the current 21st Avenue route on the Major Road Network Plan in the OCP.
- 2. Remove the 21st Avenue route on the Major Road Network Plan in the OCP.
- 3. Keep the portion of the 21st Avenue route running between Johnston Road and Redford Street and delete the balance south of Redford Street on the Major Road Network Plan in the OCP.

Option 1

This option would allow for long term planning for the 21st Avenue arterial road and the protection of the road right-of-way when opportunities come forward to the City of Port Alberni.

Option 2

This option would preclude the City's ability to protect and acquire right-of-way for a long term arterial road. There would be no major north/south arterial roads being planned or designated in the OCP, for future traffic movement within the City of Port Alberni.

Option 3

Option 3 is to delete the 21st Avenue route south of Redford Street, but maintain the proposed route section between Redford Street and Johnston Road. Although it would still be a long term transportation project this option would permit planning for a 21st Avenue connection from Redford Street to Johnston Road. As previously stated this would connect three major transportation nodes, provide for improved emergency response and provide for a second crossing of Rogers Creek. The 21st Avenue route to the south of Redford Street would be deleted from the OCP and would not be a long term road project for the City of Port Alberni. The route for 21st Avenue south of Redford Street provides for a good engineering alignment, but from a land use planning perspective it would have an environmental impact and would also significantly impact the City of Port Alberni's trail system.

Conclusions

If any of the proposed ring road options were to be constructed, it is recommended that a connection of Burde Street and Argyle Street to a ring road be considered as long term road projects in the OCP. Although this would provide future connections to a possible ring road, it would not provide for any new arterial road for traffic movement north and south within the City of Port Alberni.

Although 21st Avenue is a long term road project and would not be built for some time, deleting it entirely from the OCP would be a significant shift in the City of Port Alberni's planning for major road projects. The ACRD board has received the ring road report by Binnie and Associates. However the report has not been included in any OCP or land use plan for the regional district. Until there is some certainty regarding if any of the ring road routes will actually be built, it is recommended (Option 1) that the 21st Avenue arterial road, remain on the Major Road Network Plan in the Official Community Plan.

No public comment or stakeholder input has been undertaken regarding a proposed change to the Major Road Network Plan in the OCP. Amendments to the Official Community Plan are normally sent to the Advisory Planning Commission for a recommendation to Council. If City Council wishes to proceed with an amendment to the Official Community Plans, Major Road Network Plan it is REGULAR COUNCIL AGENDA - SEPTEMBER 14, 2015 67

recommended that the issue be referred to the APC and the Traffic Committee for recommendations to City Council.

Recommendation

That the report from the City Planner dated September 9, 2015, be received and Council for the City of Port Alberni confirm that the 21st Avenue arterial road remain on the Major Road Network Plan in the Official Community Plan.

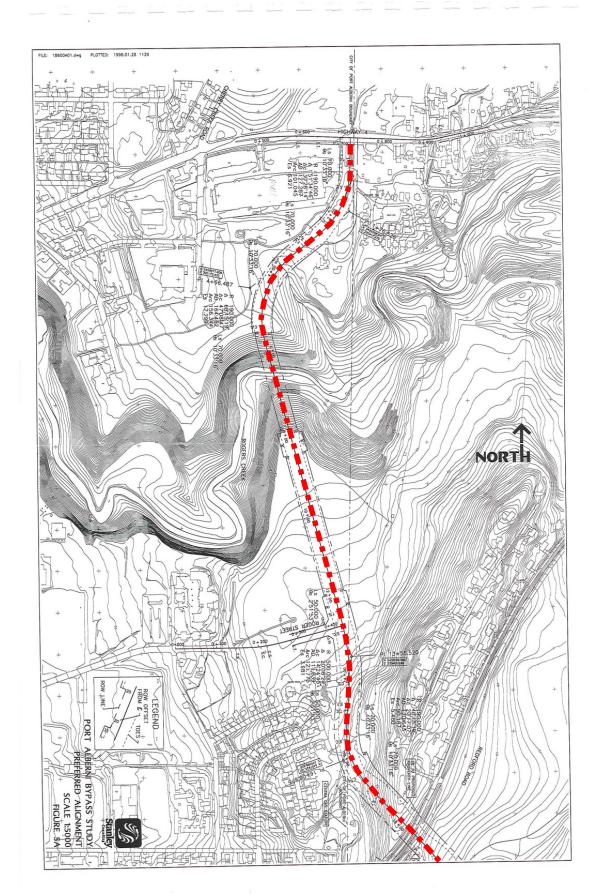

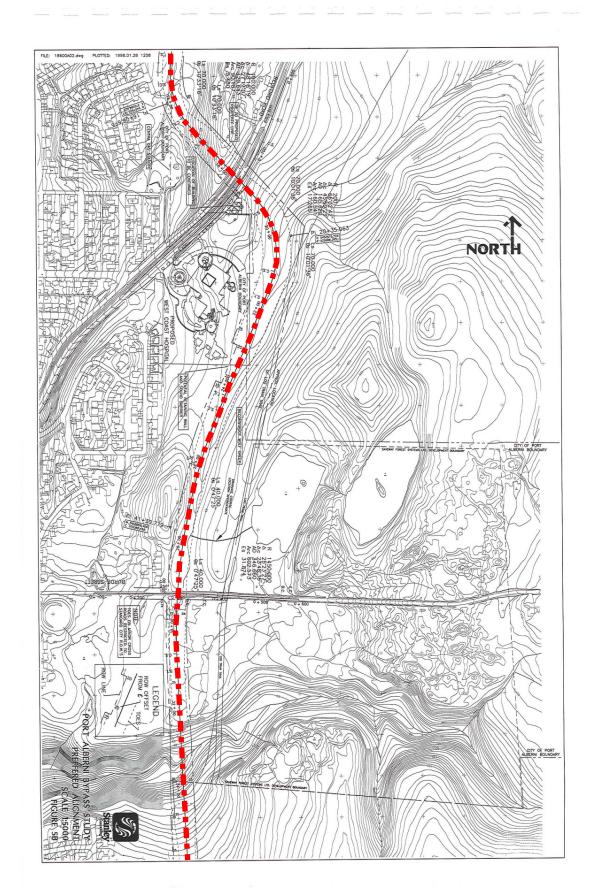

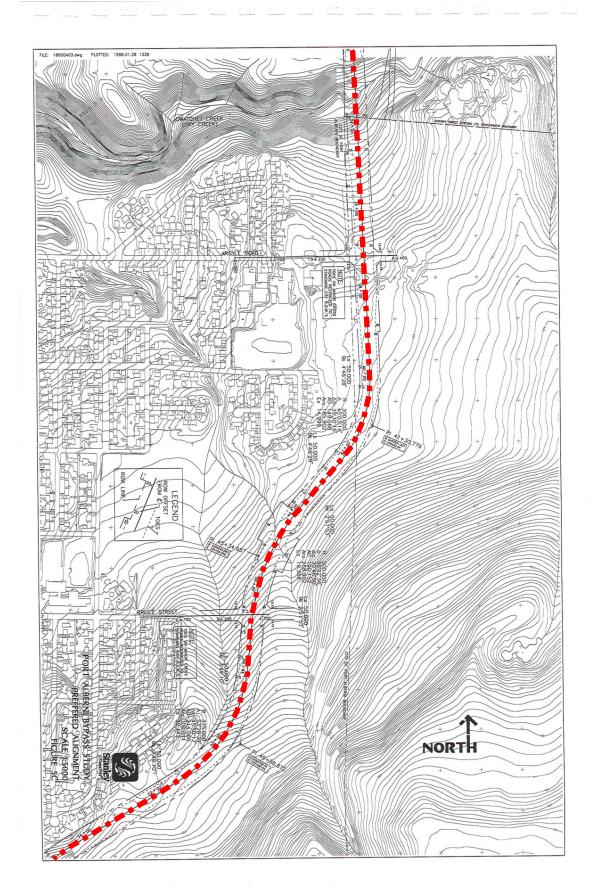
Map 8: Major Road Network Plan

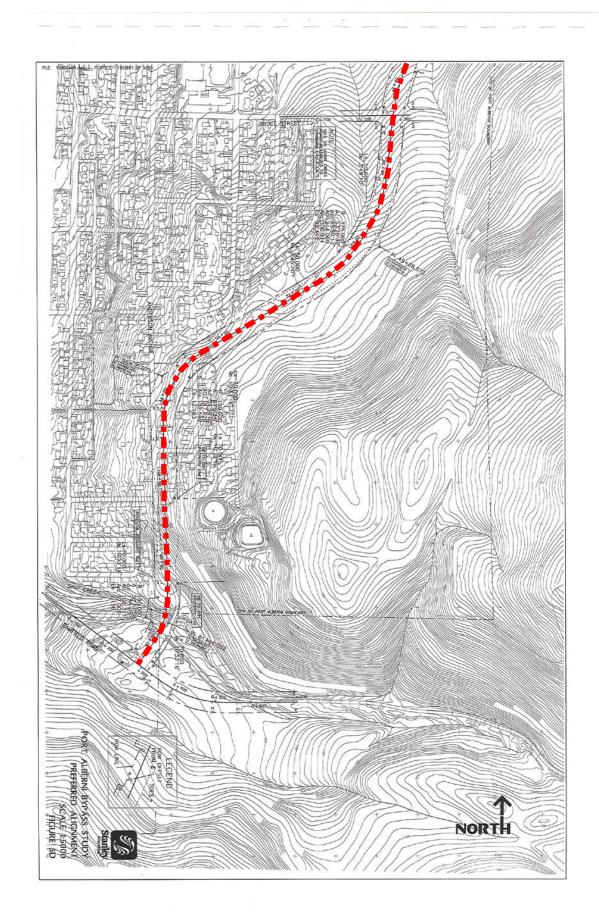
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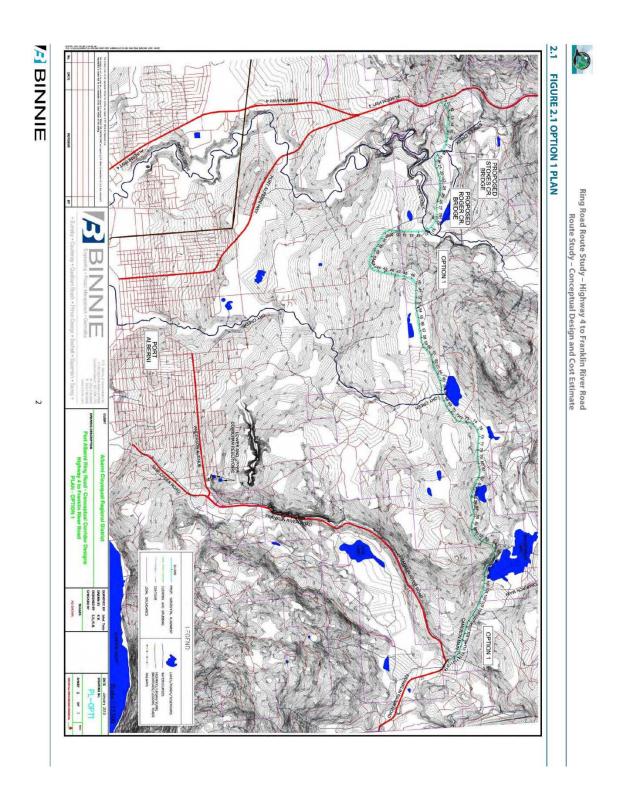


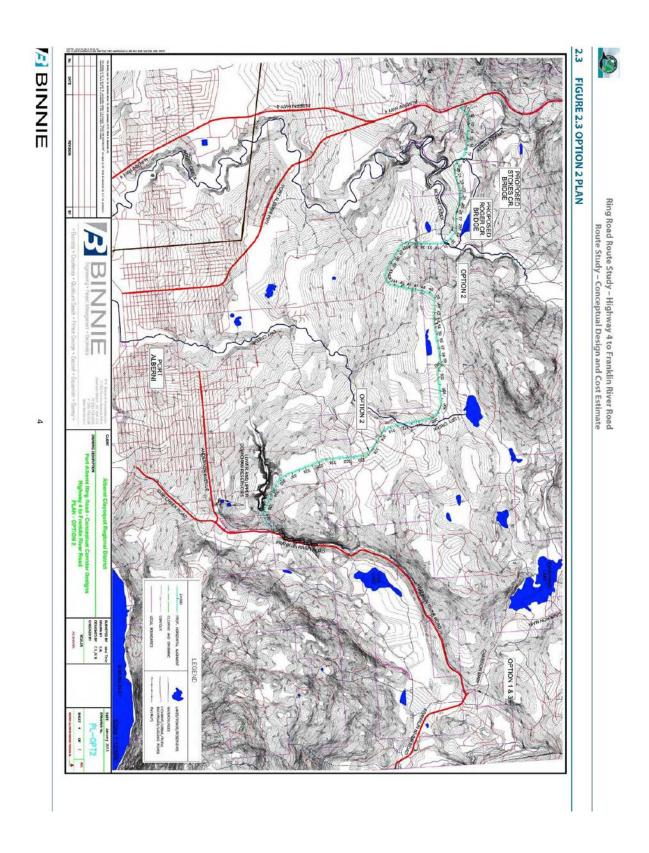


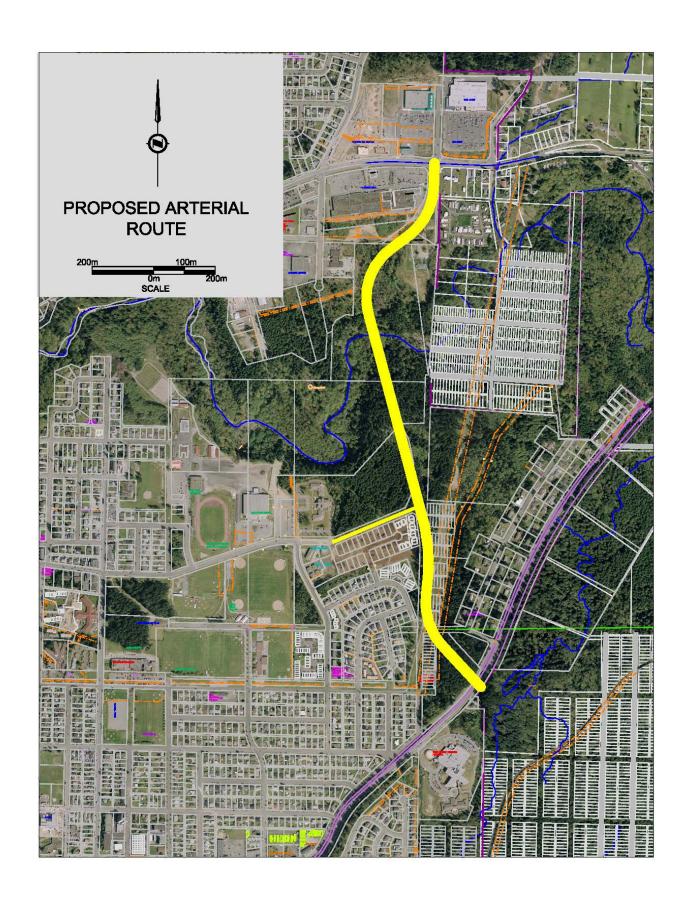

SUBJECT: RCMP Contract Operating Surplus for their fiscal year ending

March 31, 2015

ISSUE:

The RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve balance exceeds the maximum of \$1 million at present. The accumulated balance as of March 31, 2014 was \$961,041.63, and the surplus arising from the RCMP's March 31, 2015 year end financial statements was \$612,749.00, for a total of \$1.573.790.63.

BACKGROUND:

The purpose of the RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve was to have available funding in the event of major investigations or extraordinary events not funded by the RCMP operating contract. At the February 25, 2013 Regular Council meeting, Council directed the RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve continue to be funded to a maximum of \$1 million.

DISCUSSION:

The RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve current balance is \$1,573,790.63, of which \$573,790.63 exceeds the maximum of \$1 million, set per previous Council direction. The City's statutory Land Sale Reserve is depleted at approximately \$77,500 at the present, which limits the City's ability to acquire lands that will enhance Council's Strategic Plan. A transfer of the excess RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve to Land Sale Reserve will somewhat restore the Land Sale Reserve in the absence of city owned land sales, and enable Council to continue forward with its Strategic Plan.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Director of Finance recommends transferring the excess RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve funds of \$573,790.63 to the Land Sale Reserve Fund.

The following resolution is recommended:

That the report from the Director of Finance dated September 1, 2015 be received, and Council for the City of Port Alberni direct the transfer of \$573,790.63 from the RCMP Operating Surplus Reserve to the Land Sale Reserve.

SUBJECT: 'BUSINESS WALKS' BEING ENCOURAGED BY BCEDA

Issue:

The BC Economic Development Association (BCEDA) is encouraging municipalities to host 'Business Walks' during Small Business Month (October) in 2015. In late August the BCEDA announced more than 45 communities in BC had committed to a Business Walk. Council is being asked if they would like to do one of these.

Discussion:

A 'Business Walk' is a day dedicated to learning more about local businesses through short face-to-face interviews done in the business itself. Local leaders and key community stakeholders visit a large number of businesses with the intention of gathering some first-hand knowledge that could help form part of a business retention or attraction strategy. The Business Walk generally also serves to strengthen relationships with the business community.

During a Business Walk, teams of 2 or 3 people go into every business in a specified area and ask a few questions designed to give all participants a sense of the business environment.

The most common 3 questions asked are these:

- 1. Please rate the current state of your business?
- 2. What do you like most about doing business in the area?
- 3. What can be done to help your business thrive?

It is generally one of the tools used by a community as part of a more comprehensive Business Retention and Expansion Program.

In 2013, Community Futures, the Chamber and the City partnered on a more comprehensive Business Retention Survey in Port Alberni which gathered a great deal of data and formed the basis for a 'Top 10 to Tackle' (a list of issues to address). In 2014, a few of the previous Council members conducted an informal Business Walk, primarily in the lower Johnston Road area.

Although only one day in length the Business Walk would require significant staff time in advance of the day to organize the teams, identify the business areas to be visited, alert the business community and prepare the response sheets. Subsequent to the Business Walk, the

answers gathered by the teams would be input to our Business Counts software (used for the Business Retention Survey) and a report prepared.

If Council chose to go ahead with a Business Walk, the Boards of Community Futures and the Chamber could be asked if they would like to participate to update the findings of the Business Retention Survey. Other key organizations in the community (Port Authority, Alberni Valley Electoral Areas of the Regional District, First Nations) could also be asked if they had an interest in the Business Walk.

Also if Council did choose to go ahead with a Business Walk, a slightly different set of questions would be encouraged as follows:

- 1. How is business (please rate the current state of your business)?
- 2. What could be done to help your business thrive?
- 3. Of the Top 10 issues identified in the 2013 Business Retention Survey, which 3 would you give highest priority to?
- 4. Is there another issue you consider more important than any of those identified in 2013?

Options:

1. <u>Direct Staff to Organize a Business Walk</u>

Pro: would signal to small business that the City 'supports' their success
Pro: would allow for a comparison to the 2013 Business Retention Survey findings
Con: would take Economic Development staff time away from other Council priorities

2. Do Not Do a Business Walk at this time

Pro: keep Economic Development staff focused on other Council priorities
Pro: the 'Top 10 to Tackle' list may still be the most relevant issues for business
Con: miss the opportunity to connect with the small business community at this time

Council direction on this matter is sought. The 'Top 10 to Tackle' from the 2013 Business Retention Survey is included below for Council's consideration.

The 'Top 10 to Tackle' (the list of priority issues from the 2013 Business Retention Survey)

- 1. Attitudes: Potentially the most significant obstacle to growth, attitudes within the community topped the list of barriers
- 2. Beautification: Dedication to beautification from the entrance of the community and throughout is high on the list. Look good, feel good, be proud
- 3. Business Succession: Many business owners are nearing the end of their working careers yet have no exit strategy
- 4. Business Training: Electronic Media and Customer Service to compete with competitors and attract / retain customers
- 5. Employee Attraction: Many professional services have identified a recruitment problem and this issue is expected to continue
- 6. Quay Improvements: Parking, retail / event offerings, aesthetics en route, consistent hours of merchant operations and signage to get there
- 7. Marketing and Promotion of our Community: Tell the world how great Port Alberni is Improve Port Alberni's Brand
- 8. North Port / South Port: All areas of community to be considered equally
- Second Highway: A second highway is viewed as ideal to help all aspects of the economy
- 10. Taxation / Tax Incentives: Monitor and use them to support business

SUBJECT: Seniors' Free Day on BC Transit

ISSUE:

Council requested a report on the viability of establishing a program where seniors could ride on public transit for free on a certain day of the week.

BACKGROUND:

Transit ridership has declined, and seniors may not be availing themselves of the opportunity to take advantage of the benefits of using public transit.

DISCUSSION:

The following information is provided by BC Transit:

Free service is not recommended by BC Transit for three main reasons:

- BC Transit's research and studies indicate that the fare is not the predominant reason that discourages seniors from using this service. The main reasons why potential riders do not use the transit service relate to misinformation and a poor understanding of how to use transit, service being unsuitable in terms of origin, destination, time of day service is required, and
- 2. Free rides to a specific target market can set a precedent to others. A reduction in the senior fare could be considered, however this conflicts with the BC Transit fare policy guidelines and recommendations.
- 3. The reduction of fares reduces one of the City's funding sources.

Suggested Options:

A proactive approach is recommended, that is aimed at attempting to increase senior transit ridership by creating or increasing the awareness of this service that is offered by the City and BC Transit. There are a number of programs that have been developed and implemented BC Transit within the province – with varying success:

Option 1

Partnering: Implementation of this program involves partnering with a seniors' centre located in close proximity to a bus route, offering an educational session with their members and then demonstrating with an actual trip on an in-service bus. Potential customers could join this session

as many times as they like. This could easily be adapted as a volunteer program and be offered quarterly or more frequently. Volunteers working with the local transit operator and the City, identify seniors' centres and bus routes as well as any nuances with the service that the potential customers should know. Volunteers would also provide a summary report from each session. Volunteers would receive a complimentary monthly pass for the period in which the program run (e.g. quarterly) which is used for training and personal use.

Promotion and Cost – Posters would be created for display at seniors' centres, prominent locations in the city (City Hall, Library, Echo Centre), as well as on the City's and BC Transit's website. Costs, currently estimated at \$1,000 (depending on scope) would be expensed through marketing budget of the Annual Operating Agreement.

Evaluation – the impact of this program should be evaluated annually to determine its success by surveying attendees to see how much the service is being used.

Option 2

Bus Buddy: The Bus Buddy program (started in Victoria, was highly effective and morphed into a formal program known as a Community Travel Training program), where seasoned transit riders/volunteers can be offered free transit fares/passes to help take out new riders out and assist them in learning to ride the system (particularly for a more senior audience who may be intimidated by riding transit and reading schedules, etc.). One can expand this program (potentially more efficiently when volunteers are in demand) by having volunteers taking out groups of seniors from senior centres, activity centres, healthcare facilities, etc.

For successful implementation of Option 2, volunteers should have a good knowledge of bus routes as well as any nuances with the transit service that the potential customers should be aware of (e.g. interpreting the printed schedule, transfers, etc.), work with the City and Diversified Transportation to identify locations to promote the service, circulate marketing materials to promote the program and provide a monthly summary report of activities. The volunteers would receive complimentary monthly passes for the period in which the program run that is used for training purposes and personal use. Cost will be expensed through marketing budget of the Annual Operating Agreement; however it is expected to be more than Option 1 as it may involve dealing with customers on an individual basis. Security checks of volunteers may be required as they will be dealing with potential customers on a one on one basis.

Evaluation – based on reporting back from volunteers on activity and perceived success rates.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Director of Finance recommends implementation of Option 1 – Partnering. The cost is minimal, at approximately \$1,000; and the program will enhance service to seniors, and transit ridership.

The following resolution is recommended:

That the report from the Director of Finance dated September 10, 2015 be received, and staff be directed to implement Option 1 in collaboration with BC Transit, a partnership with a seniors' centre (Sunshine Club) to offer an educational session and actual trip on an inservice bus designed to raise awareness of the service offered by the City and BC Transit.

PUBLIC WORKS

Argyle and Kingsway Capital Improvements:

- **Hiring Processes** We are currently interviewing for Lifeguards (casual).
- New Hires/Postings
 - GIS Technician we have hired Byron Lloyd who started on September 8 as our GIS Technician. This position was formerly Engineering Technician 2 (mapping) and vacated upon the retirement of Linda Scobbie.
 - Building and Plumbing Inspector Rob Gaudreault has rejoined the City in this role.
 Rob was the Building Inspector for the Regional District.
 - Program Assistants (Multiplex) Lyndsey Taylor, Miya Henson, Colton Gomez-Leishman, Kaitlyn Heck, Eileen Ursel

Occupational Health and Safety

• **Confined Space Program** – The City has recently updated and completely revised our confined space program.

Community Development Activities

- Community Investment Program An additional community workshop took place on Wednesday, September 2, 2015 at 4:00 pm. A total of 68 organizations were represented at the workshops. The deadline for applications is October 1, 2015.
- Social Planning Council Met with the Council to further discuss the creation of an Advisory Commission to advise Council on social issues. A report will be coming to Council at the October 26, 2015 meeting.

Information Technology Activities – Jeff Pelech

- Work has begun on the installation of the audio/video equipment for the Council Chambers.
 The wiring has been run. The Shaw technician will complete installation of the cables and
 equipment. Testing of the equipment and the creation of the audio/video signal is expected
 to begin next week. I think it's too much to say we can stream Council meetings in
 September, but it will be close.
- We had repeated test sessions to get our old internal phone system working on the Shaw PRI network that we have been converting to. Unfortunately, we were unable to get the system working. Our old equipment is a large contributing factor. Testing and the PRI cutover have been put on hold, and we are proceeding with the RFP for the new internal phone system. RFP is being prepared with a closing date of September 30. The RFP has a 30 day timeline for the project to begin.
- Tempest was onsite Aug 24-28 for the implementation of the new Tempest business licensing module
- Microsoft Dynamics migration to version 2015 from current version 2010 is well underway.
 Brilliant Technologies has installed client for testing with the testing being undertaken by the Finance Department.
- Project for replacement of Class software for Parks, Recreation and Heritage is underway.
 Three live demos of the top three contenders are scheduled for September. The success of this project for us is dependent upon the participation of the involved departments: IT, Finance, Parks, Recreation and Heritage.
- The Public GIS Web Map ended its 10 day trial Aug 21 and has gone into its warranty period. We will release and announce it to the Public in the immediate future, but want to do some media build-up and advertising first.

Parks, Recreation, Heritage Activities

 Summer programs are now finished. Exit interviews were conducted with summer program staff.



Aquatic Centre re-opened September 8th. Exciting changes to the pool include the Mural Project that was a partnership between the Community Arts Council and Parks, Recreation and Heritage. Bright colours were added through painting the pergola and new furniture.



A number of issues were uncovered during the annual shut down. Including rotted pipes from the supply system to the main pool.



The underwater lights are corroding. Light bulbs burn out and constantly need replacement. Currently experimenting with an LED bulb that may last longer but is much more expensive. Trying it out in one fixture for now.

SUBJECT: Permissive Tax Exemptions for 2016-2019

BACKGROUND:

The current four year term for permissive tax exemptions expires December 31st, 2015. New applications for 2016-2019 were invited this year from eligible community organizations.

In addition to the requirements of the *Community Charter*, Council's policy for permissive tax exemption states that the land or buildings shall provide for at least one of the following:

- athletic or recreational programs or facilities for public use;
- services for special needs groups;
- facilities or programming for youth and seniors;
- protection and maintenance of important community heritage;
- seniors care facility;
- arts, cultural or educational programs or facilities;
- emergency or rescue services;
- services for the public in a formal partnership with the City or;
- preservation to an environmental or ecologically sensitive area designated within the Official Community Plan.

DISCUSSION:

Staff undertook a detailed review of each organization's folio resulting in a number of amendments and corrections being made to the Roll by BC Assessment. The most notable correction to the Assessment Roll is in regards to the tax exemption eligibility for the Cottages on 10th Avenue owned by the Alberni Valley Senior Citizens Home Society. It was found that these had been incorrectly granted a statutory exemption from taxation under Section 220(1)(i) of the *Community Charter* since their construction in 2010. Section 220(1)(i) of the *Community Charter* applies to:

i) a building that was constructed or reconstructed with the assistance of aid granted by the Provincial government after January 1, 1947 but before April 1, 1974 and that is owned and used exclusively without profit by a corporation to provide homes for elderly citizens, together with the land on which the building stands.

Pioneer Towers continues to qualify under this section and remains statutorily exempt from taxation. BC Assessment has notified Alberni Valley Senior Citizens Home Society that the Cottages will become fully taxable in 2016.

Places of Public Worship folios were also examined in detail by staff. The Knox Presbyterian Church on Regina Ave is no longer operating and the property will become fully taxable in 2016.

The Community Investment Program Committee met on August 19, 2015 to consider applications received and to review and discuss exemptions for Places of Public Worship. Committee Members in attendance were Russ McLaughlin; Ron Jorgenson; Kenn Whiteman and Councillor Paulson. The Committee held a second meeting on September 1st, 2015 to meet with representatives of Port Alberni Gymnastics Association to further review their application.

The Committee recommendations are as follows:

- That Council proceed with adoption of a new Places of Public Worship Bylaw (as attached)
 and that within the next four year term a policy/guideline be implemented to establish
 specific criteria for granting permissive tax exemptions to ensure consistency for all places
 of public worship. This will likely involve a review of what other municipalities do in regards
 to exempting places of public worship and may result in a portion of these properties
 becoming taxable in the future.
- That Council proceed with adoption of a Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaw for the 2016-2019 term for the organizations outlined on the attached Notice which were deemed to meet the criteria outlined in the *Community Charter* as well as Council's policy.

Applications denied are:

- Alberni Community & Women's Services Society for property at 3054 3rd Avenue which they have purchased and are actively seeking a tenant for – does not currently qualify for exemption
- Alberni Valley Senior Citizens Home Society Cottages do not meet criteria for exemption

The attached notice indicates the organization, the subject property and an estimate of the tax revenue to be foregone. These estimates are required as a condition of the *Community Charter*, but are calculated based on the 2015 assessment roll so are subject to change. This notice will form the basis of the public notification required to be provided under the terms of the *Community Charter* prior to Council's adoption of the relevant bylaws.

A BYLAW TO EXEMPT CERTAIN LANDS AND IMPROVEMENTS FROM TAXATION FOR THE YEAR 2016

Whereas Section 224 of the *Community Charter*, RSBC 2003 provides that the Council may by bylaw, in accordance with the section, exempt land or improvements or both from taxation under Section 197 (1) (a) of the *Community Charter* to the extent, for the period and subject to the conditions provided in the bylaw, and;

Whereas Council deems it appropriate to exempt certain properties from taxation.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ALBERNI IN OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Title

This Bylaw may be known and cited for all purposes as "Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaw 2016, Bylaw No. 4887".

2. Exempted Properties

The lands, and all improvements thereon unless otherwise indicated, as set out in Schedule "A" are exempted from taxation for the period prescribed in Schedule "A" in accordance with Section 224 of the *Community Charter*.

READ A SECOND TIME THIS DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 2015.

READ A THIRD TIME THIS DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 2015.

Port Alberni Men's Slowpitch League (168 sq.ft) Part of Lot 1, District Lot 1, Plan 14814

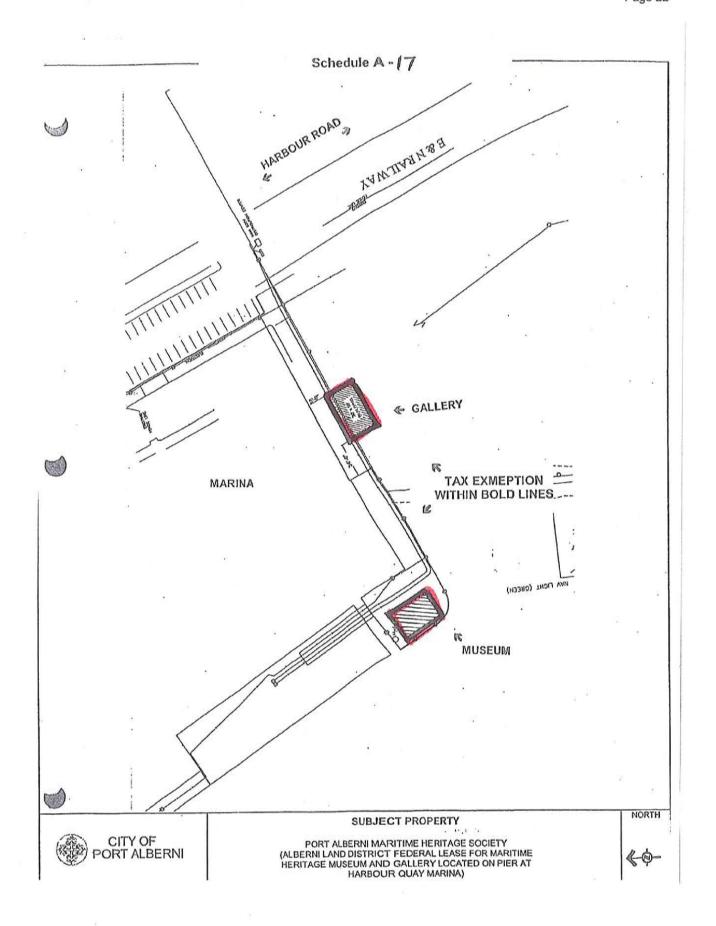

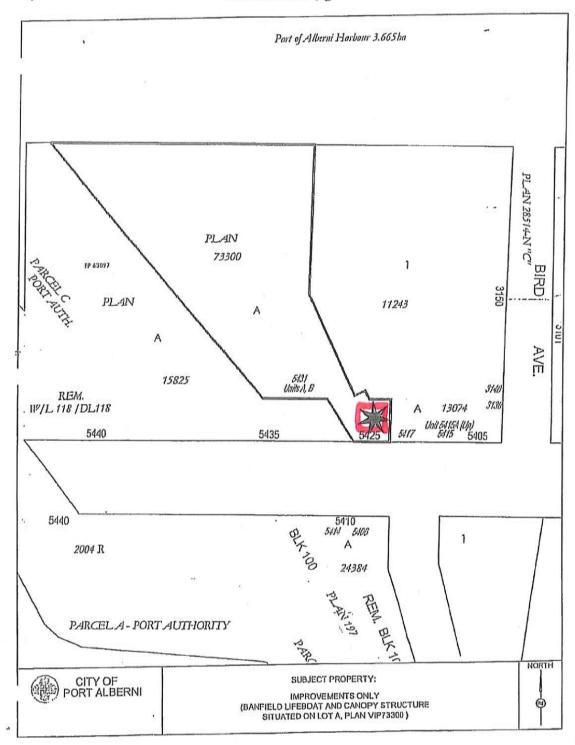


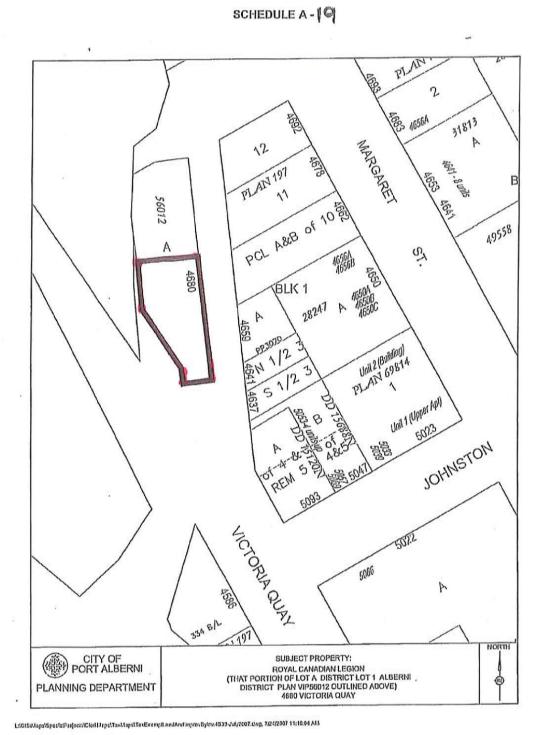

BYLAW NO. 4886

PLACES OF PUBLIC WORSHIP EXEMPTION BYLAW

WHEREAS Section 224(1)(f) of the *Community Charter* provides that Council may exempt from taxation, in relation to property that is exempt under section 220(1)(h) of the *Community Charter*:

- (i) an area of land surrounding the exempt building;
- (ii) a hall that the Council considers is necessary to the exempt building and the land on which the hall stands, and
- (iii) an area of land surrounding a hall that is exempt under subparagraph (ii).

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to exempt land or improvements used or occupied by a religious organization for the purpose of public worship.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ALBERNI, IN OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. TITLE

This Bylaw may be known and cited for all purposes as "Places of Public Worship Exemption 2016, Bylaw No. 4886".

2. EXEMPTIONS

The balance of land and improvements, not otherwise exempt pursuant to Section 220(1)(h) of the *Community Charter*, are hereby exempted by Council from taxation for the following properties:

from the Northerly boundary of said Lot 16. (PID: 004-625-919)

Applicant: E. Drew dba Slammers Gym Inc.

ISSUE

At issue is the consideration of an application for a Development Variance Permit (DVP). The applicants are applying to vary Zoning Bylaw regulations to decrease the number of required parking spaces for the permitted uses.

BACKGROUND

The property at 4065 6th Avenue is designated Institutional in the OCP and zoned P1 – Institutional in the Zoning Bylaw. The site specific Zoning amendment application has been approved by City Council on the property to allow the operation of a restaurant on the premises. The property is 40.2 metres (132 ft.) wide, and has a depth of 45.7 metres (150 ft.) giving it an area of 1839.4 m² (19,800 ft²). The legal frontage and current parking spaces are accessed off Wallace Street and the physical entrance to the building is located off 6th Avenue.

Although there is no proposed expansion to the building, the change of use for a portion of the building, from hall to restaurant, results in a higher parking requirement. In order to permit the operation of a restaurant a variance is required to the parking regulations.

DISCUSSION

Surrounding Area

The area is a mix of commercial, light industrial, institutional and residential uses. There are multi-family residential buildings directly to the east of the property on 7th Avenue, with office buildings and John Paul II Catholic School on the other side of 7th Avenue. To the north is the hydro right-of-way with the main transmission towers, with offices and Slammers Gym further north. To the west are the Telus building and former BC Hydro facility. To the south is City owned park property that is leased to the Italian Society, with a funeral home facility further south and residences to the southwest.

Parking

The Zoning bylaw regulations for the Required Amount of Parking:

- Restaurant 1 per 4 seats
- Public Assembly place 1 per 40 m² (431 ft²) of gross floor area or 1 per 4 seats, whichever is greater

The reconfigured parking lot (plan attached) will have 16 on-site parking spaces, including 2 handicapped spaces. The upper hall area requires 13 parking spaces. The proposed 80 seat restaurant requires 20 parking spaces. The Zoning bylaw regulations would require a total of 33 on-site parking spaces for the proposed project. The applicant is requesting to reduce the number of on-site parking spaces required from 33 to 16, a variance of 17 parking spaces.

Although the requested parking variance is significant, the former Italian Hall has hosted many large events with several hundred people. The location of the property has some advantageous circumstances for accommodating parking. Wallace Street is adjacent to the Hydro transmission tower right-of-way that is City owned land. A significant amount of on-street parking can be accommodated along the north side of Wallace Street without interfering with any private property. On-street parking on 6th Avenue in front of the Telus building also provides further parking without interfering in the business.

STATUS OF THE APPLICATION

At the July 30, 2015 meeting of the Advisory Planning Commission the following motions were made and carried:

- 1. That the City of Port Alberni Advisory Planning Commission recommends to City Council that the City proceed with the necessary Development Variance Permit to vary Zoning Bylaw 4832 as follows:
 - a) Vary Section 7.9 Required Amount of Parking regulations from 33 parking spaces to 16 parking spaces, a variance of 17 parking spaces for the property located at 4065 6th Avenue.
- 2. That City Council direct staff to give notice of intent to consider the issuance of Development Variance Permit No. 87 for 4065 6th Avenue.

At its August 10, 2015 regular meeting, City Council received the APC recommendations for 4065 6th Avenue. A copy of the notice for Development Variance Permit No. 87 is attached and notification was given as required by the Local Government Act.

CONCLUSIONS

Although the on-street parking cannot be considered in order to meet the parking requirements of the Zoning Bylaw, the unique circumstances in the area of 4065 – 6th Avenue could be considered in the variance request. Given the history of large events being held at this location, the on-street parking does not have a significant impact on the adjacent properties.

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The Planning Department supports the issuing of a Development Variance Permit No. 87 for 4065 $6^{\rm th}$ Avenue.

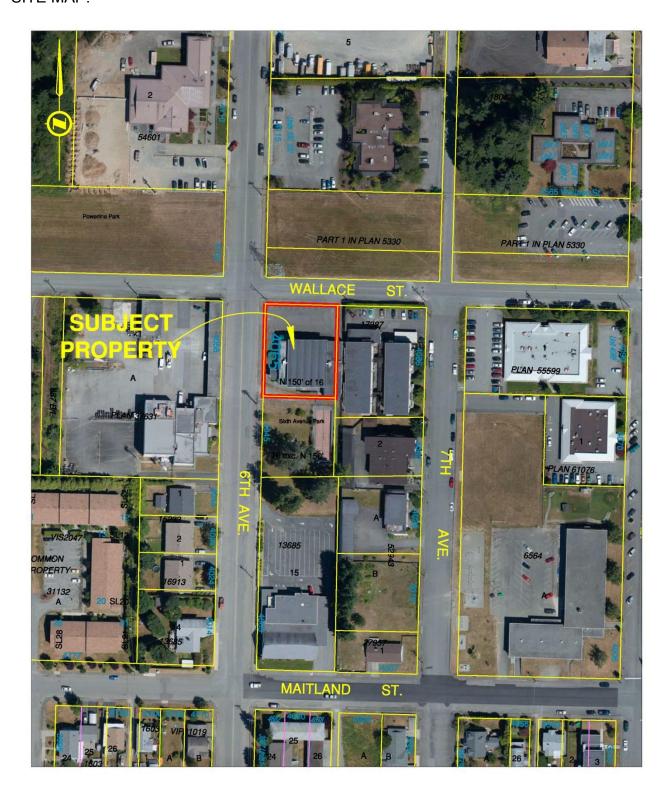

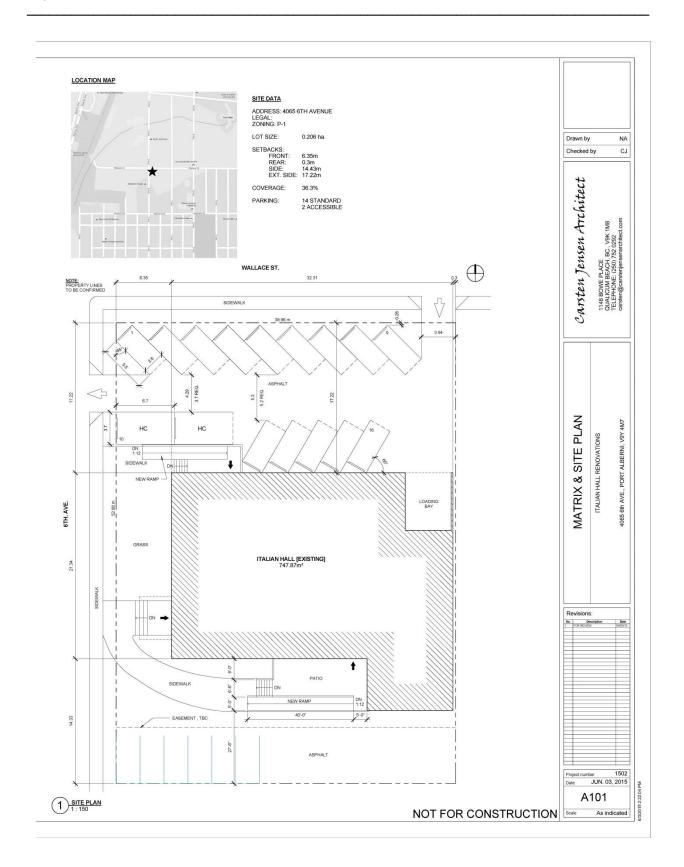

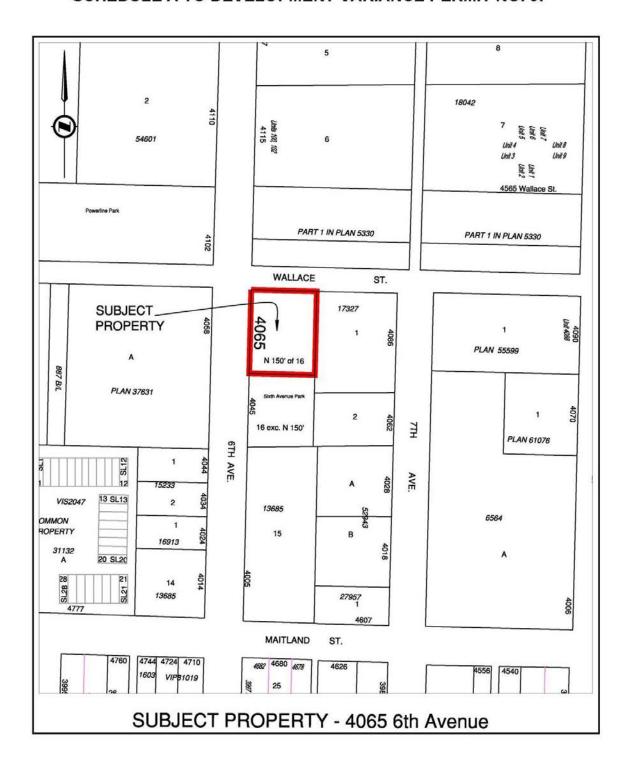

<u>Issue</u>

To consider an application for a Development Variance Permit to vary the Zoning Bylaw regulations for the maximum number of building storeys permitted and the maximum building height permitted for a proposed development at 3033 - 3rd Avenue.

Background

The owner of the currently vacant lot is proposing a mixed use development that would consist of 40 residential units totaling 3,483 m 2 (37,490 ft 2), plus 8 commercial units with 553 m 2 (5,952 ft 2) space. The attached plans show the five storey building elevation and the general interior layout of the building. The 1st floor contains 8 commercial units as well as storage locker spaces for the residential units on the upper floors and a mechanical room. Each of the 4 residential storeys will include 10 dwelling units for a total of 40 units. The two bedroom units vary in size from 72.5 m 2 to 80 m 2 (780 to 861 ft 2). Each residential unit is equipped with a small balcony.

The property at 3033 - 3rd Avenue is one legal parcel (see attached aerial plan) and is zoned C7 – Core Business. The proposed mixed commercial and residential building is a permitted use in the C7 zone. Multi-family residential development in the Uptown area is supported in the Official Community Plan and the Uptown and Waterfront Redevelopment Study. The property is within Development Permit Area No. 2 (Commercial). The development permit process will require a review of the form and character of the project and will be presented to City Council for approval. This report covers only the requested variances to the Zoning bylaw for the project at 3033 - 3rd Avenue.

Discussion

Surrounding Area:

The property is located along the main 3rd Avenue commercial artery in the uptown area. Small businesses and offices are the primary occupants in all of the surrounding properties with some buildings currently containing some residential and/or office units above the ground level.

Building Height:

The C7 zone has density bonusing provisions that allow a developer some latitude to increase the number of storeys and maximum height permitted if certain criteria are met. Under the density bonusing provisions, the permitted number of storeys is increased to six and the maximum height is increased to 18 metres (60 feet). The proposed project does not meet the density bonusing provisions and the applicant is therefore seeking variances for the project.

The standard maximum building height permitted is 14 metres (45.9 ft) in the C7 zone. The applicant is seeking a variance of the maximum building height from 14 metres to 17 metres (55.7 ft).

Some of the neighbouring commercial buildings to the east may have their views of the Alberni Inlet impacted. With the natural downward slope of this area from east to west, the impact on the views should be reduced. The building will not impact the important view corridor along Argyle Street. There will be a limited shadow effect for nearby properties to the west across 3rd Avenue. These are primarily commercial properties and the shadow effect should not be as significant as it would be for residential buildings.

Number of Storeys:

The maximum number of building storeys permitted in the C7 zone is four (4). The applicant is seeking a variance of the maximum number of building storey from four (4) to five (5). Although this building would become the tallest in the Uptown area, it would not be the tallest in the City as the residential building near 10th Avenue and Morton Street is ten storeys. An elevator is proposed to provide access to all storeys in the building.

The Fire department has done a very preliminary review of the concept plans and does not object to the height of the building. A full code review will be required at the building permit stage for the project.

Open Space / Balconies

There is no requirement for common Open Space or Balconies in the C7 Core Business zone however the developer is proposing to include a small balcony on each of the 40 residential units. Many modern residential towers do not provide balconies.

Parking

In the C7 zone most commercial uses do not require on-site parking because of the amount of on-street parking provided in the area. Therefore, parking spaces are not required for the commercial portion of the development. Residential dwellings in the C7 zone require on-site parking of 0.5 parking spaces per residential unit above commercial space. The required parking for the development would be 20 spaces. The proposal includes plans for 28 parking spaces including 2 handicapped spaces which exceed the requirements.

Some residents who will live in the building will not have vehicles. The need for every resident to have a vehicle is reduced in a downtown setting as the residents can take advantage of shopping at the local businesses and make use of the available transit.

At its August 10, 2015 regular meeting, City Council received the APC recommendations for 3033 3rd Avenue. A copy of the notice for Development Variance Permit No. 88 is attached and notification was given as required by the Local Government Act.

Conclusions

There are two variances to the Zoning Bylaw being requested for the project at 3033 3rd Avenue as noted below:

- 1. To increase the maximum building height by 3 metres to 17 metres.
- 2. To increase the maximum number of storeys permitted from 4 to 5.

The proposed project is a major redevelopment in the Uptown core and will add a significant residential component. The Official Community Plan and the Uptown and Waterfront Redevelopment Study both support residential densification in the Uptown Core. Residential uses above ground floor commercial uses can provide different forms of housing, increase vibrancy in the area and enhance the area as a people oriented place.

The Planning Department supports the issuing of a Development Variance Permit No.88 for 3033 - 3rd Avenue.

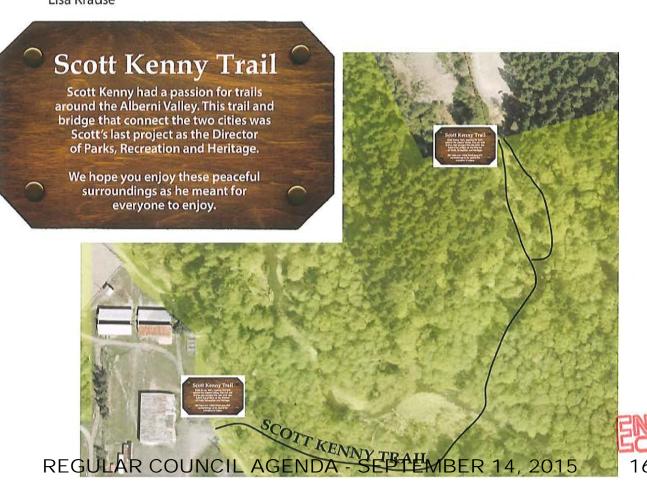
Dear Mayor & Council,

Thank you for the meeting on June 9, 2015, and the follow up letter of June 22, 2015. I am pleased to hear that since our meeting there have been a few new developments regarding the topics we discussed.

The draft City of Port Alberni Watershed Management Plan that you provided to the South Island Natural Resource District (SINRD) is in the process of being reviewed by our West Coast Natural Resource technical staff. We appreciate the opportunity to review the plan and you can expect comments back later this summer.

Regarding your request for further information on log exports, I understand that John Cook, our Timber Export Specialist, was able to meet with your council and SINRD staff with a presentation on log export policy. I trust you found this presentation useful and informative and encourage you to follow up with John Cook, Timber Export Specialist, by phone at 250 387-8916 or by email at John.R.Cook@gov.bc.ca, if you have any further questions.

Finally, I understand that you continued your discussion with SINRD regarding opportunities for Project Based Learning, with a plan to meet again in September regarding next steps for the learning centre and locations for learning opportunities. In the long term, this work may involve the potential expansion to your community forest agreement as discussed; however, this expansion cannot proceed until district staff have finalized tenure commitments for local First Nations.

I greatly appreciate your support regarding local forestry matters, a sector that contributes so greatly to our community's wellbeing. Your attendance at the ADSS Project Based Learning (PBL) graduation ceremony underscores this support and was certainly a highlight for the students and their families.

The addition of approximately 31 hectares to the Alberni Valley Community Forest for use by the PBL program will definitely assist in furthering this program's success and mitigating the impacts of the proposed airport expansion. 1. Introduction

The meeting was chaired by Darren Saare. The minutes of the 11 June 2015 meeting were adopted, moved by Margaret Vatamaniuck and seconded by Bill Randles.

2. Old Business

Discussion regarding the sunshine Club's Community Resource Guide was tabled until Maureen Brechin is able to attend.

3. New Business

There was a general discussion about the New Horizons for Seniors Program. It was agreed that this program may be used for future new projects and upgrades, to increase transportation for seniors such as increasing the HandyDart hours .This is a multi-year funding pool. Darren Saare will consult with Jake Martens about the status of prior transportation studies. It was agreed that the committee needs a list of community stakeholders for seniors. Darren Saare will action this item.

Elder Abuse: Denis Sauve is waiting to hear back from the Sunshine Club about setting up a presentation at a later date. This item was tabled until the Sunshine Club is available for consultation.

Housing: There are on-going discussions with Davina Hartwell as to process researching the need and setting up stakeholder's meetings. Darren Saare to meet with Patty Edwards at the MLA's office to get their support and determine initial processes. It was noted that the Stakeholder's Committee to End Homelessness in Port Alberni has been very successful and serves as a good example for us to spearhead a similar project for seniors.

Denis Sauve advised the committee that he intends to make a motion in council to undertake a feasibility study to make bus fares free for seniors on Mondays. He indicated that the customer base would be small and have little negative impact on the city budget but give seniors a fare break. The committee discussed the pros and cons at length and voted to support his intent to make this motion before city council.

Many of us remember the Seaman's Haven on 2^{nd} Ave. Which looked after the needs of seafarers. That Seaman's Haven has been gone for nearly twenty years.

The needs of seafarers have not gone away. Many have families, and they need to contact their loved ones back home. They may need to buy a SIM Card, or find appropriate reading materials. But their first question always is: "Where is the nearest WIFI centre?" or "Do you have a seafarer's meeting place?"

Anyone who has gone down to Harbour Quay on winter evenings when a ship is tied up in port, will see small groups of men huddled in front of the Blue Door Café in the wind and the rain trying to contact their homes. For many of them who are 'on the circuit between Asian ports and North America', Port Alberni is their first and often, and only port of call in three weeks and ready access to communications is very inconvenient.

NAMMA- -North American Maritime Ministries Association, is our sponsoring organization. We are partnering with them, local churches, ITF (the International Transport Federation – the Seafarer's Union), Port Alberni Port Authority, local businesses and service organizations and the City of Port Alberni. They ask us to garner support from local communities in what ever that form takes: advice, encouragement, direction, and moral support. If local organizations find it in their hearts and budgets to financially contribute to the start up and continued financial maintenance of this project, that is laudable and worthy of public identification and our thanks.

Our aim is to build a Seafarer's Centre on a piece of property contained on Port Alberni Port Authority dock area. The parcel they have chosen is next to the Maritime Heritage Centre south of Harbour Quay. Hydro and WIFI are accessible and the building is to be in a secure compound that the seafarers can get to with ease. We want to provide a lending library of several hundred books. As one ship captain pointed out, books, magazines, and news material are hard to come by in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, and "We have been looking at the same faces for 23 days!" This is evidence of an intellectually hungry man!

We, the representatives of the Seafarer's Ministry would like the opportunity to thank you for allowing us to tell you about this worthwhile project.

An independent selection committee will consider the nominations.

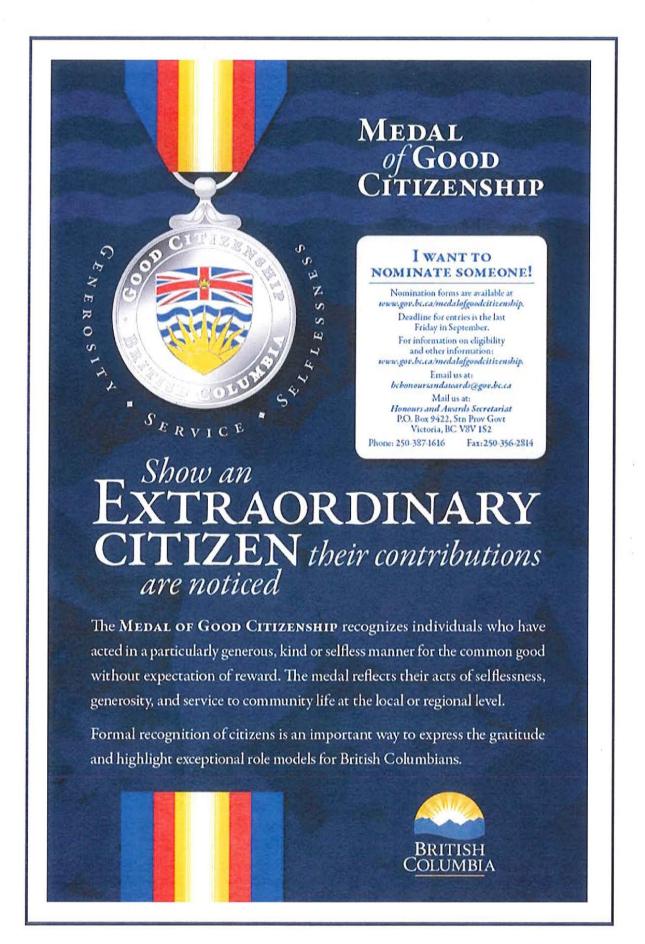

PURPOSE

Provincial honours are a memorable and distinctive way for the government of British Columbia to thank and pay special tribute to those British Columbians whose lives exemplify excellence and achievement of the highest order. The men and women we honour are truly representative of the province of British Columbia's caring and diverse society, and their lives and deeds stand as shining examples for us all.

In 1989, the government of British Columbia established the British Columbia Medal for Good Citizenship to recognize persons who have acted in a particularly generous, kind or selfless manner for the common good without expectation of reward. This Medal was launched in 2015.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any Canadian citizen who is a current or former long-term resident of British Columbia is eligible for nomination for the BC Medal of Good Citizenship. No elected federal, provincial or municipal representative may be awarded the Medal while such person remains in office. The Medal is not awarded for acts of bravery. Self-nominations will not be accepted. There is no age limit—youth nominations are welcome.

HOW ARE RECIPIENTS SELECTED?

An independent selection committee considers all nominations.

WHEN ARE THE AWARDS PRESENTED?

The inaugural Medal of Good Citizenship presentation ceremony will be held late 2015. Medal recipients are notified by phone in advance of the ceremony.

Re: Asbestos Awareness and Registries

Dear Prime Minister:

I would like to start by thanking you and the federal government for putting the effort into apprenticeship trades training. Without the highest standards and safest learned practices, the construction and maintenance industries would be fraught with many more injuries and fatalities it typically sees.

Which brings me to the reason I'm writing you. As you well know, the mining of asbestos shut-down a couple of years ago, and Canada is no longer exporting this dangerous product abroad to emerging countries like India to process. However, asbestos is not unlike a land mine waiting patiently until someone often not directly involved with the purpose walks innocently by and ends their life. Of course the one is usually immediate, while the other prolongs a person's painful existence, the Canadian construction landscape is checkered with these delayed landmines.

As a 35 year construction and shipyard electrician, I have watched many friends and co-workers diagnosed with pleural plaques on their lungs and asbestosis. This diagnosis is nothing less than a death sentence, they slowly and prematurely wither away, and die an agonizing death due solely from breathing, while at work.

For the past 14 years I have served as the President of Vancouver Island's Building Trades, an organization of approximately 7,000 construction workers, who also move in and out of the west-coast shipbuilding and repair industry.

The proliferation of products containing asbestos throughout the building construction industry over the past 75 and more years will likely go down in modern-day civilized history as one of our worst self-inflicted health care casualties, and it will not subside for many years to come. The best we can hope for is to mitigate its relentless wake.

Therefore, we are calling on the Federal Government as well as all provincial and municipal governments

Products containing Asbestos, and to make that registry online and available to all restoration and construction workers and companies so they may see if the buildings they (will) work in, have asbestos products and what form those products containing the asbestos fibers are in (ie. floor tiles, ceiling tiles, insulation, drywall, pipe and cladding, etc), and how best to remove or disturb each type of product. We are proposing the Building Registry begin with all public buildings, our parliament, legislatures, office and administration buildings, schools, hospitals, city halls, and associated real estate and public work yards.

We are also calling on the Federal and provincial governments which utilize public marine transportation, the Canadian Navy, Coast Guard, Ocean Sciences, and any other publicly owned vessel to develop and establish a National Vessel Registry of all Maritime Vessels which utilize Products and equipment containing Asbestos. That the Registry be available online so that Canadian Shipyard Workers can obtain the information on the products that could potentially kill them prior to them beginning work on the particular equipment, system or vessel structure.

When we properly identify and publish the risks construction/shipyard/remediation, and all workers face, the Canadian workforce will be better prepared and we will all benefit from reduced and controlled exposure. That was essentially the national thrust of programs like; "Right to Know" and "WHMIS".

The baby boomer generation is well versed in asbestos we have seen its extraction from our lands, we have used it, we have lived and worked with it all around us. We are on the eve of mass retirement with a new generation of workers who know very little of the harmful effects asbestos exposure can cause.

Therefore, we are calling on the Federal and provincial governments to develop a plan to better educate our youth moving into the construction and heavy industry sectors with the purpose to help identify products made of asbestos and those which can often contain asbestos, by establishing the last week of April as "Asbestos Awareness" week. This would be in-step with our closest neighbour and largest trading partner as the USA have recently proclaimed the first week of April dedicated to the same cause. Why we are suggesting the last week of April as, April 28th is globally known as the "Day of Mourning", a day recognized to honour those who lost their lives while at work, and the number one fatal illness in Canada are those workers who died from inhaling asbestos dust. We believe the highest level of respect we can give those who lost their lives while at work is to fight for those who continue to do the job, to educate the living against the dangers, so they can return home to their loved ones.

We are also recommending that a national standard apprenticeship be developed known as "Hazmat Worker" so those that are involved in remediation have the developed skills and knowledge in proper procedure of remediation of asbestos products. Today these workers are lucky to receive any information of the asbestos product they are removing, how to remove it safely and maybe a throwaway pair of coveralls and a dust mask. Many of them are hired by a labour broker as an independent contractor so they have no recourse to the unsafe work.

Lastly, we are calling on the Federal Government and provincial governments to move forward on Legislation banning all products containing asbestos to cease being imported into Canada. We have finally come to grips with what the rest of the world's developed nations have known for decades, products containing asbestos can be fatal from simply drawing a breath of air, something we all do 20-30 thousand times each and every day. Currently, our import laws allow unregulated importation of asbestos products, they can be found in anything from our after-market vehicle brake pads, some types of building piping, laminate flooring and many other products without our knowledge.

As a business manager I am responsible for those that come in to visit our establishment, if I ignore the sheet of ice at the front entrance and that causes an individual pain and suffering from their fall our business is liable for that pain and suffering. The asbestos tragedy in our eyes is no different, our governments know of its existence in their buildings, it is the tax payer at some time that will be financially impacted, not necessarily the employer who simply came to pull the data cabling throughout a building disturbing the asbestos dust in the ceiling tiles, causing the workers death.

Canadians look towards their elected officials to champion the causes that serve and protect them, it is our own elected officials who for the past five decades have allowed this travesty to continue and spread with full knowledge of the personal anguish, pain and sorrow it was causing. It is time to write a new chapter on this tragic story, with pages of education, transparency, understanding, and knowledge.

We look forward to seeing real action with measurable results on this file in the names of those who have lost their lives, their families, as well as those young adults entering the trades today.

I would like to thank you for your time in reading our recommendations and look forward to a day when every worker can obtain the information they need to do their job in the safest way possible.
