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Boat, RV and Trailer Parking and Storage Regulations

This information is being provided to owners of boats, recreational vehicles (RV's), travel or holiday trailers, and utility trailers in the City of Port Alberni as part of an ongoing effort to reduce parking congestion; increase pedestrian safety; improve sight lines; and improve efficiency of street sweeping, snow removal, and garbage collection services.

The following regulations apply the parking or storage of all boats, RV's, and trailers:

The Traffic Control Bylaw #4670

- No vehicle shall be parked on the street for the principle purpose of storing the vehicle. (A trailer disconnected from the tow vehicle is considered stored)
- No vehicle shall be parked on a sidewalk, crosswalk or boulevard (a boulevard includes the area between a property line and a road or sidewalk).
- No vehicle shall remain parked on a street or highway continuously in any one location for more than 96 hours.

Zoning Bylaw #4832

- Every property is limited to one RV and one boat for storage purposes.
- One boat, not exceeding 9 m (29.5) in length, and one RV may be stored on your property at the side or rear.
- One boat **OR** one RV may be stored on your property in front, in your setback, on a hardened surface. The other may be stored in a side or rear yard.
- No other vehicles or things may be stored in the front yard (front setback).

Motor Vehicle Act (Provincial Legislation)

 No person shall use or park a vehicle coupled to a trailer on a street or highway without displaying a valid number plate on both the vehicle and the trailer.

The City of Port Alberni requests that the owners of vehicles identified by this notice voluntarily comply with the regulations and move them to an appropriate location as soon as possible.

Boats, RV's or trailers parked or stored in violation of the regulations may be subject to impound at any time.
